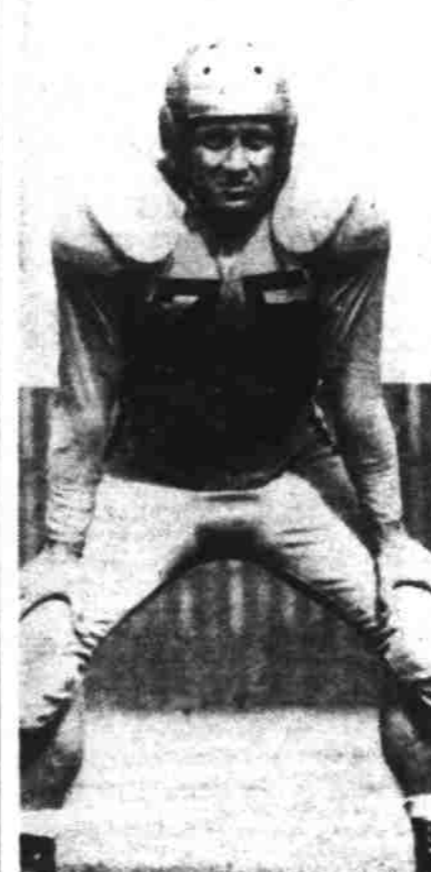
Dragons Nose Angels, 19-13
