However, traders pointed At Controls of out that prospects have continued to improve since October 1, when data for the government report was collected.

The December wheat contract drew some support from government purchases of 2,169,000 bushels of cash wheat yesterday and at one time moved to a new seasonal high of \$2.9412. However, practically all the gain was lost
