Rails Advance In Stock Mart

NEW YORK, Oct. 17 (AP)—The long-slumbering rails came to life in today's stock market and, together with assorted strong special issues, helped offset light selling of many leaders.

Oils were ahead from the start. Carriers steamed up after midday and scored their second average advance in two weeks and the wildest upturn since Sept. 30. Offerings persisted here and there in the final hour and top gains running to 3 or more points were reduced at the close in the majority of cases with minus signs predominating. The day's aggregate was 1,270,000 shares compared with 1,400,000 Thursday. The Associated Press 60-stock composite, due to the presence of several sharp gainers, was up 1 of a point at 66.8, a top since Aug. 1 and the sixth successive day without a decline. Of 1,054 issues registered, 366 rose, 451 fell and 237 were unchanged.

CHICAGO, Oct. 17 (AP)—Grains today ran into their first weak session since margins were hiked at government request Oct. 7, wheat and corn losing several cents while oats were down more than a cent. Prices are still above those prior to the margin increase. Traders were inclined to view the downturn as a normal technical development in view of recent gains.

Wheat closed 1 1/2-3/4 lower, December \$2.98 1/2-3/4, corn was 1 1/2-3/4 lower, December \$2.31 3/4-2.32, and oats were 1 to 1 1/4 lower, December \$1.19 1/2-3/4.

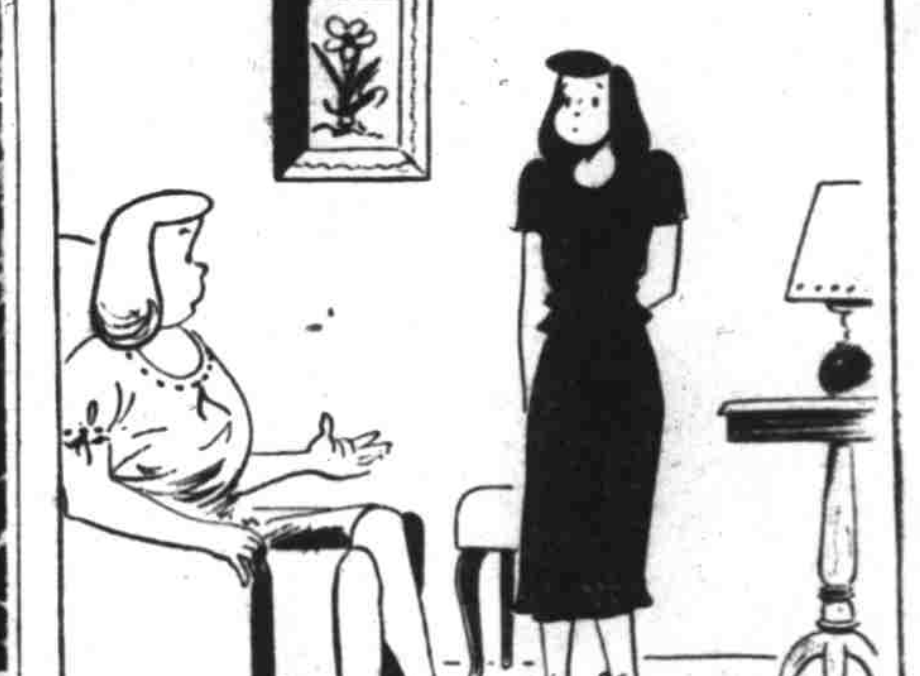
Decentralization Said Answer to Parking Problem

M. L. Boyd Dies In Newberg

NEWBERG, Oct. 17 (AP)—Death has claimed M. L. Boyd, 72, newspaperman and a war correspondent for Ohio papers during the Spanish-American war. He died here last night.

He published newspapers in Iowa and Washington, and from 1913 to 1927 he published the Dallas, Ore., Itemizer. He came here in 1927 to operate a book store, serve as justice of the peace and sell insurance. For many years he was Newberg's correspondent for the Associated Press.

Census Shows Oregon to Gain Representative

WASHINGTON, Oct. 17 (AP)—Shifting tides of population, marked by a strong westward flow, are expected to affect the congressional representation of at least 18 states after 1950 and strengthen or diminish their voice in presidential elections thereafter.

New population estimates by the U. S. census bureau show that seven states would gain members in the house and representatives and 11 would lose.

The same states would also gain or lose electoral votes for the election of the president and the vice president.

Trend Apparent

The census bureau's estimates are based on figures for July 1, 1947, whereas the next actual reapportionment will be based on the 1950 census. The trend is apparent, however, and census experts say there may be even greater changes between now and 1950 if the migratory movement continues.

California, with a population jump of nearly 2,500,000 since 1940, would gain seven house seats on the basis of the 1947 estimate. It has shown an average gain of one U.S. representative and one electoral vote a year for the seven-year period. Electoral votes for each state equal the total number of its representatives, plus two for its two senators.

Other gains: Michigan, 2; and one each from Washington, Oregon, Florida, Indiana and Maryland.

Losses: New York, 3; Pennsylvania, 2; and one each for Arkansas, Illinois, Kentucky, Mississippi, Missouri, New Jersey, North Carolina, Oklahoma and Tennessee.

Box Company Files Suit Against SP

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 17 (AP)—Damages of \$2,250,000 were asked of the Southern Pacific railroad by Martin Brothers Box company of Toledo, Ohio, in a claim filed with the interstate commerce commission charging failure to deliver boxes to the company's Oakland, Ore., lumber mill.

Miss Edith H. Cockrill, attorney representing the company, said the action charges the railroad company with discrimination in its distribution of adequate cars between January and September of this year.

Navy Planes Found

EL PASO, Tex., Oct. 17 (AP)—Two naval aircraft overdue in El Paso from North Island, San Diego, Calif., were reported found by Biggs field air rescue service late tonight. One made a crash landing between Oja Laguna and Agua Nueva, Mexico, about 200 miles south of Juarez, and the other landed at Pecos, Tex. Biggs field officials reported. Neither pilot was injured.
