

Recreation Field In Japan Honors West Coast Man

BRUSH COLLEGE — An athletic field built upon terraced rice paddies which once fed Japanese soldiers at Shinodayama barracks, Japan, has been named for an American soldier, Pvt. Robert Freer of Tacoma, who was drowned while on occupation maneuvers in Japan last September.

Pvt. Freer was the son of Mrs. Betty Stockwell, 843 E. Oak, Tacoma. Freer field construction was a \$200,000 job financed by the Japanese government out of war reparations funds. The paddies upon which it was built had fed Japanese soldiers stationed at Shinodayama since 1904.

The field was dedicated during a double-header baseball game opening the 25th division league's season. The division specialists defeated the 24th infantrymen both games. Many friends of Freer were present for the ceremonies, including 2nd Lt. Robert E. Thomas, his company commander.

WAYS TO SERVE AND CONSERVE by Carol Drake

4 meals for four with one smoked picnic

Buy a smoked picnic shoulder; make it the meat for 4 meals for four. At 55 cents a pound, a 6-pound picnic costs \$3.30, or 21c per serving. Here's how a whole smoked shoulder can be economy.

MEAL NO. 1 - Baked, glazed and garnished for dinner; sliced and served with sweet potatoes, cauliflower, fruit salad and lemon meringue pie.

MEAL NO. 2 - Diced, about 2 cups, and creamed potatoes equal a casserole main dish. Or make filling for sandwiches.

MEAL NO. 3 - Jambalayah! Brown 2 cups chopped meat with 1/2 cup each chopped onion, celery and green pepper in a heavy frying pan. Add 1 cup uncooked rice and 2 1/2 cups tomato juice. Season. Simmer, covered, until rice is done, about 45 minutes. Add more water if necessary.
