**Stock Market In Nose-Dive**

NEW YORK, Oct. 30 (AP)—Stocks went into one of the steepest nose-dives of the past two months in today's market but supporting bids arrived at the last and substantially cut extreme losses of 1 to 4 or more points. The Associated Press 60-stock composite was off 8 of a point at 65 1/2 at a bottom since Oct. 8. Of 1,041 issues registering, 816 fell and only 88 rose. Bethlehem Steel, up at one time, finished off 3/4 of a point at 97 1/2 and, after the close, directors of the company declared the usual \$1.50 dividend on the common and proposed a 3-for-1 split up of the capital stock. The board reported net of \$2.87 a share for the September quarter against \$3.61 in the June period and \$2.99 in the third 1946 quarter.

**Wheat Loses Added Ground**

CHICAGO, Oct. 30 (AP)—Wheat lost further ground on the board of trade today, influenced by uncertainty regarding government price control action, reduced cash grain buying by the Commodity Credit Corporation and slightly better reports on winter wheat seeding. While the bread cereal continued downward, corn reversed its trend and finished with moderate gains. Wheat closed 3 1/4-3 1/2 lower, December \$2.89 1/2-1, corn was 1 1/2-2 1/2 higher, December \$2.21 3/4-2.22, and oats were 1/2 lower to 3/4 higher, December \$1.10-1.10 1/2.
