Vrooman Rites Slated Monday

Funeral services for William Vrooman, 74, moulder and steel fabricator in Salem for many years, will be held at the Clough-Barrick chapel Monday at 3 p.m. The Rev. Maxine Roberts of Portland officiating, with interment in the City View cemetery.

Vrooman died at a local hospital Thursday after an illness of one week. He had lived at 3220 State st. for many years. He was born at Bloomington, Ill., and came to Salem in 1909. His first wife, to whom he was wed in Illinois in 1901, died here in 1935. He married the former Sarah Key of Salem in 1943 and she survives him.

Vrooman worked for the Salem Iron works for a number of years before going into business for himself. He was noted throughout the northwest for his work as a molder of brass and iron. He was a member and officer of the First Spiritu-ualist church of Salem.

Surviving besides the widow are a niece and nephew who live in California.
