Inferiority Complex Treatment Discussed at 'Clinic of Christ'

"There's never been anyone like you—the Christian challenge is for you to be your best self and to walk on your own feet," Dr. Raymond B. Walker of Portland told Salem business and professional men Friday as he discussed the treatment for inferiority complex, as given in "The Clinic of Christ."

At Dr. Walker's third talk here in the annual Churchmen's forum series at the YMCA, Charles A. Sprague, chairman of the YM's religious committee, announced that arrangements had been made for a fourth appearance here December 5. More than 50 men have attended each meeting.

Dr. Walker, pastor of Portland's First Congregational church used as his case history the New Testament story of the man who had not walked for 38 years and had persuaded himself there was no cure because he had "no one to help me" into the healing pool. He was declared to be overwhelmed with a sense of personal inadequacy and compared with moderns who "enjoy ill health."

Christ's cure in this instance, according to the speaker, was getting the man to believe in himself and to stand on his own feet.

Declaring that personality will express whatever is allowed to enter into its making and that "unconsciously we reveal our real selves," Dr. Walker urged his audience to learn and make it a habit for the mind to discriminate in its acceptance of thoughts.

Parents Told of New Classes at Gervais High
GERVAIS, Nov. 21 — New agriculture buildings and shop equipment provide Gervais Union high school with the largest area of any such vocational agricultural department in the state. Ralph Morgan, Oregon supervisor of vocational agricultural departments said today as open house by the department brought out more than 250 visitors. It is hoped the buildings will be finished by the first of the year.

Gervais Union high school is the fourth Marion county high school to have an agricultural department which provides vocational training including a great variety of shop work for students, veterans and adults. Thirty-five are enrolled in the new vocational agriculture department this year, mostly in the lower classes, since it is just starting. Adult work will open up later while the veterans work is comparatively light just now, Morgan said.

Advantage of the large area provided by the Gervais school is that storage for work upon which the students are engaged is provided, Morgan said. For instance when an engine from a truck is being repaired, the truck is out of the weather while the engine is in the shop.

The home making department has 22 girls enrolled and provides the full home making course of cooking, clothing, child care, and housekeeping. Ellen Evermann is the home economics teacher, Leonard Burns the agriculture teacher. Other vocational agriculture departments in Marion county are in Salem, Silverton and Woodburn high schools.

Bus Company Moves Station
Salem's bus station for West Coast Trailways will move from 175 S. High st. to 520 N. High st. on December 1, Manager Hillis Cooper announced Friday.

At the new station site at the corner of Marion and High streets opposite the public school office building, a marquee will be erected from the building to the street to provide for bus loading in what is now parking space for the drive-in Green Spot market. The Trailways office will occupy one room of the building until the grocery lease expires next summer when the building will be remodeled as a bus station. Trailways leased the 87 by 87 foot property from Ralph Borrega of Oregon City.

School Census High at Keizer
KEIZER, Nov. 21 — Twenty per cent increase in the school population of the Keizer district is shown in the school census just completed by Mrs. Hugh Adams for Keizer district 89. Total number of boys and girls between the ages of 4 and 19 this year is 820 as compared to a total of 656 a year ago. Boys total 443 this year and girls 377, the census shows.

This is a higher percentage of increase than other districts, most of which reported increases for the year, Mrs. Agnes Booth, county school superintendent, said of Keizer figures.
