

Grain Market Sets Records; Offerings Few

CHICAGO, Nov. 24.—(AP)—Grains rang up a variety of new records on the board of trade today as steady buying encountered extremely limited offerings.

Major cause of the advance apparently was a series of congressional meetings in Washington, where the current world-wide grain shortage was emphasized by a number of agricultural experts.

Wheat closed 4 to 7 1/4 higher, December \$3.14, corn was 4 to 4 3/4 higher, December \$2.57 1/2-2.57, oats were 1 1/2-2 1/2 higher, December \$1.26-1.26 1/4, and soybeans were up 8 cents, the daily limit, March \$3.93 1/2.

The new records rung up during the day were:

December wheat set a new high for any wheat future in 30 years, at \$3.14.

Setting new seasonal highs were all wheat contracts except July, all corn contracts, December and May oats, March and May soybeans, and December, January and March lard.

Most Issues Show Losses

NEW YORK, Nov. 24.—(AP)—A smattering of stock market leaders attracted timid bidding today but the direction was downward for the majority of the more active performers.

Brokers' customers and professionals leaned toward caution pending more assurances regarding business, congressional anti-inflation developments and news from the foreign ministers' conference at London. Dividends and earnings, on the whole, again were ignored. Firming money rates and unpopularity of high grade securities persisted as bearish factors.
