

## Open House Today at New Jewish Temple

Services of dedication for Temple Beth Shalom, the Salem Jewish congregation's first permanent home, will be at 2:30 this afternoon in the temple, at 1795 Broadway st. An open house, to which the public is invited, is slated from 4:30 to 5:30 p.m.

The concrete, brick-faced structure was begun in March and just completed, to replace the congregation's temporary quarters at Chemekeeta and Commercial streets, occupied for several years. The new temple was first used for services at Yom Kippur and Rosh Hashana. It is planned to have religious services there every Friday evening according to Harry Perlman, president of the congregation.

The dedication program will include a traditional chant by Cantor Morris Ail of Ahava Sholom synagogue, Portland, accompanied by Ruth Singer, carrying of scroll to ark, Rabbi J. B. Fain, Portland; placing scroll in ark, Sam Frager, Portland; prayer, Rabbi Phillip Kleinman, congregation Neve Ezer Zede; presentation of key, Mike Steinbock, chairman of building committee; acceptance, Harry Perlman; lighting of perpetual light, Max Schlesinger; traditional chant, Cantor Ail; scripture, the Rev. Dudley Strain, First Christian church; introduction of guests, Dr. Harry A. Brown, master of ceremonies; address, benediction, Rabbi Charles E. Sydney, Ahava Sholom congregation, Portland.

**Speeches Planned**  
Addresses will be given by the Rev. George H. Swift, St. Paul's Episcopal church; Dr. Raymond A. Withey, counselor on religious life at Willamette university; former Gov. Charles A. Sprague, in behalf of the state of Oregon; Rabbi Henry J. Berkowitz of Temple Beth Israel, Portland.

The auditorium has permanent seating for 120 persons. Modern lighting, plastered interior and acoustically treated ceiling is carried over into the remainder of the building, which includes fraternal, social and class rooms. Dr. Brown said use of the rooms by youth and community groups will be encouraged.

Lyle Bartholomew was architect for the building and E. E. Batterman general contractor.
