### Music Helps

Frantic Late Shopper Can Find Any Price Gift in Record Albums, Singles

Record shops seem to be inhibited by absolutely nothing this year. During the war they suffered from lack of record players among the customers, then by lack of a good stock of records, and now there are ample numbers of both players and recordings. Shopping can be a simple matter for record collectors or persons who have relatives who are record collectors. One of the most interesting albums we've listened to for a long time is Columbia's recording of the complete score of Humperdinck's Hansel and Gretel.

The cast includes Rise Stevens, mezzo soprano; Nadine Conner, soprano; Thelma Volipka, soprano; John Brownless, baritone; Clarence Turner, contralto; Lillian Raymond, soprano, and the entire chorus and orchestra of the Metropolitan. Max Rudolf conducts.

The opera is sung in English and I was able to follow the words easily. There are 12 records in two volumes in a slipcase which adds to the attractiveness of the production. There is also a libretto included, which tells the story, shows photos and completes the work in every detail. "Shopping" in one of the record stores this week, I noted that there are a good many offerings of Christmas music, Christmas stories and single records. Children's and adult music and speaking records are everywhere.

There's quite a list of records by musicians who have appeared on the Salem Community concert series during the past few years. Many members of the association have made it a point to include records by every artist heard in their collections.

That's a suggestion for the late shopper, who will find such records at the shops.

Too new to be even listed in the stocks of Salem shops, but which has been promised in early shipments, is the album of "Songs of Faith" by the de Paor infantry chorus. Included are the "Eli Eli," "Hospodi Pomilui," "Deep River" and "Lord's Prayer," which so moved the audience here in the infantry chorus' concert last month. Though it is not now in the shops, it would be an excellent album to watch for.

The recorded version of Huddersfield choral society's "The Messiah" directed by Sir Malcolm Sargent, will be presented over station KOAC on Christmas eve from 7:30 to 9:45. Special organ concerts will be given on Christmas day.

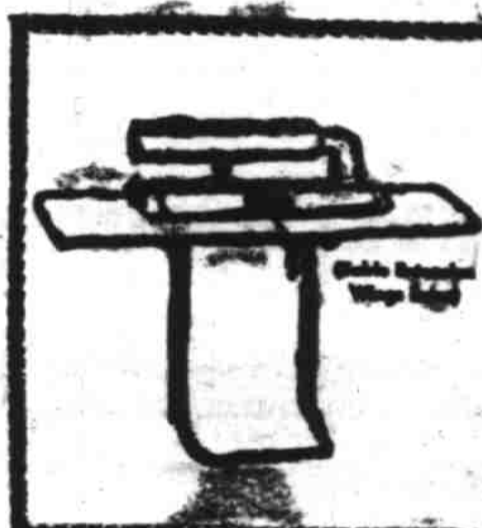

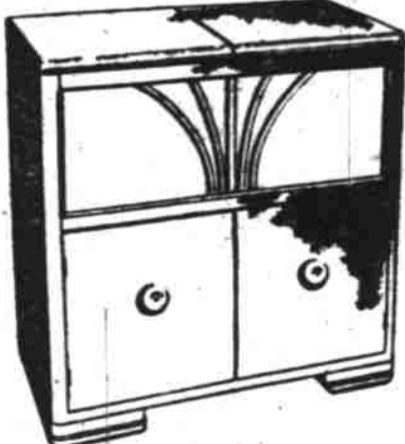
