Quisenberry's Opens Monday At New Site

Quisenberry's pharmacy, burned out in the Guardian building fire of November 3, will open its doors in a new location, 419 Ferry st., Monday morning, owner P. D. Quisenberry announced yesterday. Dominating the store in space and emphasis will be the modern prescription department, which has been operating at the Market drug store since the fire. All new fixtures have been installed in the new location, and materials are entirely new, according to Quisenberry. Practically all of the prescription files were saved, with the exception of the oldest and a few of the newest.

Also important in the change will be restoration of delivery service to its prewar status, three times daily as well as emergency. The store, established in the Guardian building in 1919, will retain its special lines in cosmetics and other products and its camera department. Due to the smaller space, the sundries lines have been reduced. Contractors for the speeded remodeling to meet the fire-caused emergency were Kelley James, carpenter; Harold Dunsmoor, painting; Goode and Denison, electricians; Graber Brothers, plumbers; Parton Fixture Co. of Silverton; Norris Zinn, cabinet maker; Frank Gray and Downs Glass Co.

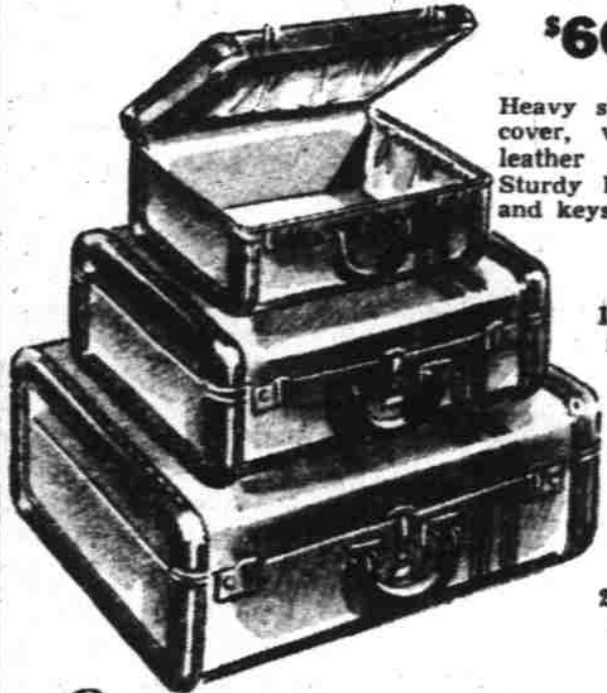
