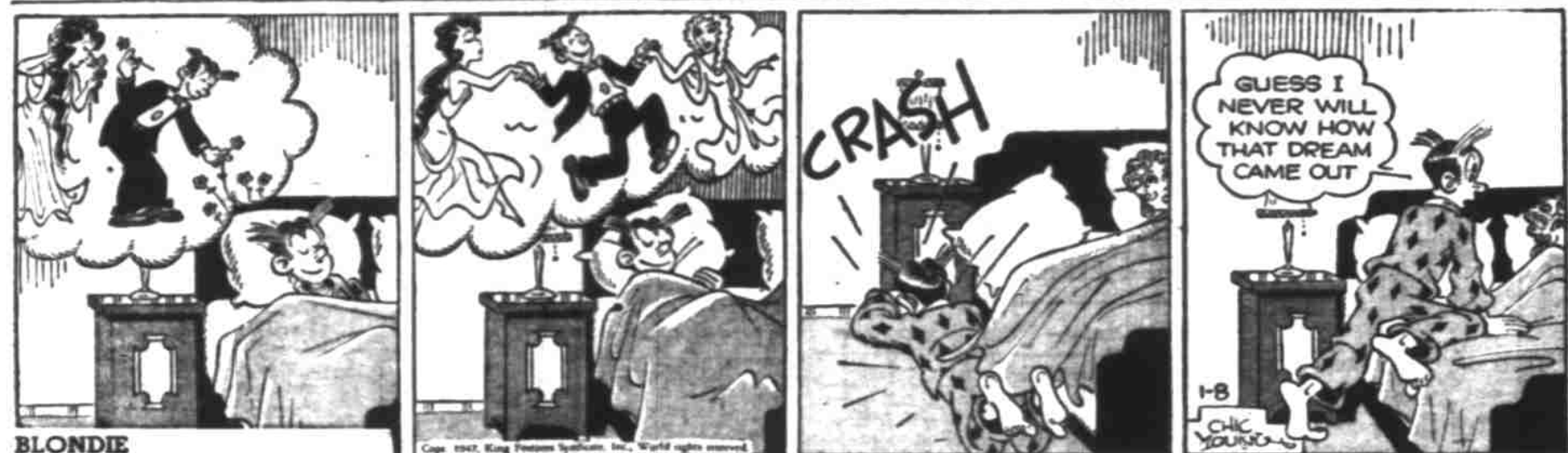

Return of Historic Battleship Oregon Said Impractical

WASHINGTON, Jan. 7 — (AP) The Battleship Oregon will probably never come back to Oregon again. That is the report of Rep. Homer Angell (R-Ore.), who has been trying to get the historic ship — partly scrapped during the last war — returned from Guam to its old site at Portland. Angell said the navy told him that the battleship's hull — all that is left of it, now — could not feasibly be towed from Guam to Portland. Reconditioning of the ship, Angell said he was told, would cost more than to build a new one.

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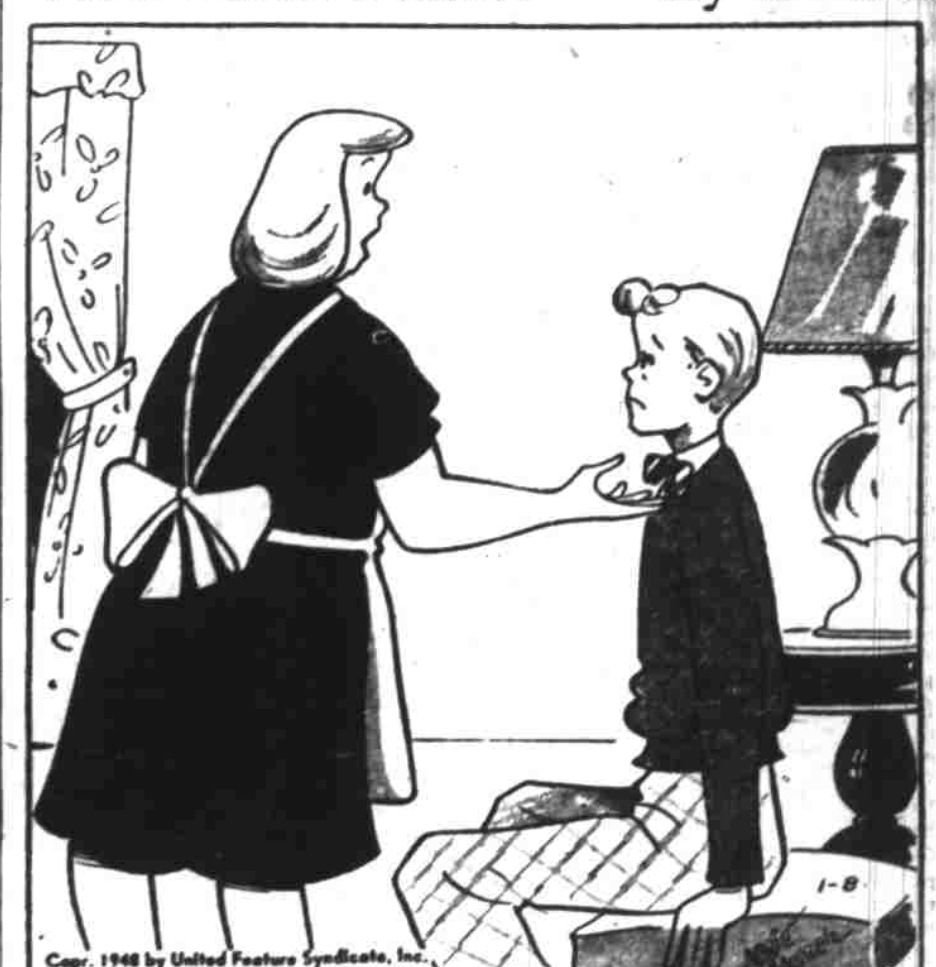

Milton Sachsel, general supervisor of the Feldt Sheet Metal company, related he grew tired of

seeing his men running out to the corner tavern. Employment at the shop ranges from 6 men to 60, depending on the amount of orders. "They are running out the back door, boom!" he said. They were running out the front door, boom! I couldn't watch both doors at once. And I'd find them in neighborhood taverns. "So I installed the bar, and now I don't spend as much a month for liquor as I used to spend a week in time lost from jobs. "Me? I drink only coffee."
