

11-Man Council To Aid Farm Labor Office

Appointment of a farm advisory council to the state employment service, comprising 11 agricultural leaders representing all sections of Oregon, was announced Saturday by T. Morris Dunne, chairman of the state unemployment compensation commission.

Two of the men are from Polk county, Ammon Grice of West Salem, fruit farmer and past president of the Oregon Farmers Union, and D. F. Kennedy of Independence, chairman of the state advisory board of the U. S. Hop Growers.

Other members are Harold Barnett of Pendleton, president of Athena Pea Growers' association; Truman Chase, Eugene, president of Eugene Fruit Growers' association; Henry Semon, Klamath Falls, representing potato growers of that area; E. C. Ziegler, Hood River, representative of Hood River Apple Growers' association; H. H. Chindgren, Molalla, farmer and youth leader; Robert K. Norris, Medford, Pineapple Packing company; Henry G. Hohwiesner, Portland, chairman of Oregon manpower committee of the Northwest Cannery's association.

The council, to hold its first meeting at 1:30 Tuesday, January 20, at the state capitol, is to advise the farm placement service

in development of a 1948 program to meet growers' labor needs, Dunne said. Recently re-assumed from federal supervision, the service will operate through the 29 local OSSES offices.

Semon and Chindgren are both members of the state house of representatives. Members who also served on the state's last such advisory council, in 1941-42, are Barnett, Chase, Fisher, Larson, Semon and Ziegler.

Formal Protest Of Deduction Ruling Slated

Formal protest of the Oregon State Employees association against the recent action of the state highway commission in refusing to recognize its employees' recent request for group life insurance deduction, will be filed with the commission early next week, Forrest V. Stewart, association secretary, announced here Saturday.

The protest charges:

1. That the highway commission has made deductions for some of its employees under a group insurance plan with another company for many years.

2. That any employee of the commission who is not a member of the association may avail himself of group life insurance through the other company.

3. That there are now more than 300 highway commission employees who prefer the plan approved by the association.

4. That the highway commission's refusal to make the requested deduction will create dissatisfaction and such action will result in partiality among its employees.

Discussion of Hearing Set At Bush School

A meeting of mothers at Bush school is slated for 1:30 p.m. Tuesday by the Marion county health department for an explanation of loss of hearing in children and for comments on a program for such children.

The weekly well baby conference at the health office in the Masonic temple, for consultation with doctor and nurse and for immunization and examination, is slated for Thursday from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. Food and milk handlers' clinic will be all day Friday at the office, and adult clinic and immunizations from 8:30 a.m. to noon Saturday.

Battery C is a unit of a Portland battalion and part of the organized reserve which receives pay for drill sessions.

Since its creation Aug. 16, 1916, the organized marine corps reserve grew from three officers and 33 men to 30,074 officers and 307,340 men out of the corps' total strength of 480,988 at the close of World War II.
