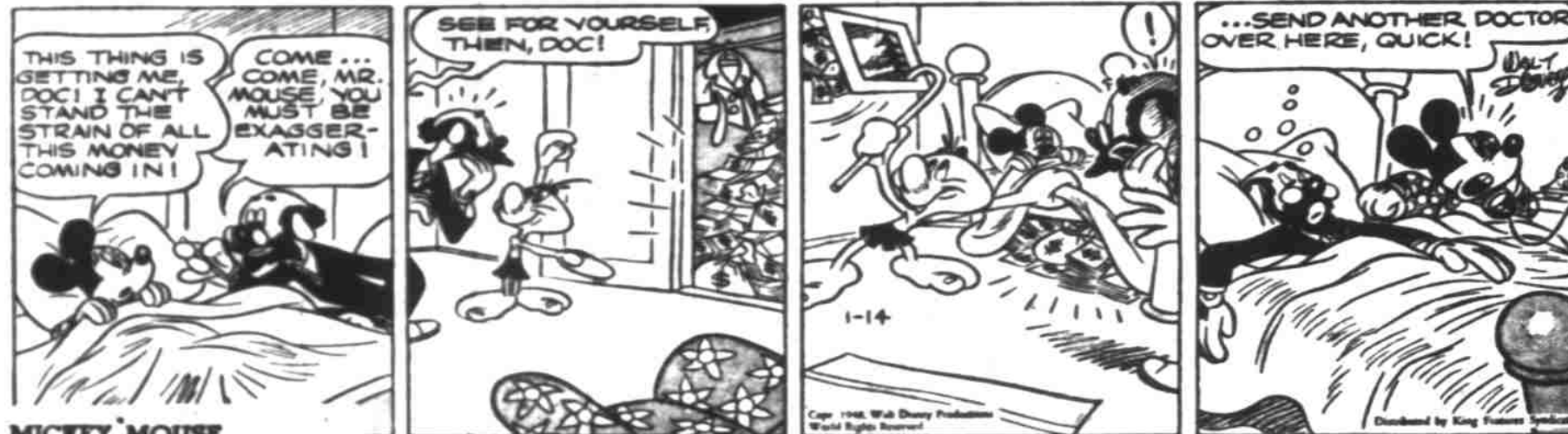

Oregon to Lose Broadcast Station

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 13 (AP)—The U. S. government's foreign broadcast information service announced today it will move its radio monitoring station from Portland, Ore., to Reseda, Calif., near Los Angeles, later this year "Due to more advantageous local operating conditions."

The announcement said a new station will be completed and ready for use in March or April. It will employ about 50 persons, most of whom will be transferred from the present Portland staff. The Oregon station has been in operation since October, 1941.

Missionaries to Nippon Find Japs Friendly

Dr. and Mrs. E. E. Getzlaff, who left Salem last summer to return to Japan where formerly they had served at a hospital maintained by the Seventh Day Adventist church, have written The Statesman a letter descriptive of the Japan they found when they arrived and relating their experiences on this second assignment to the Orient. They write: "Sailing from San Francisco in July was not so bad; we spent much time in our deck chairs where the air was more pleasant than in the lounge where the crowd was gambling — not too good an environment for the big group of missionaries of every denomination going to their various fields."

"It was thrilling to take pictures as we entered the harbor — a thing we did not dare do in the past — and our American soldiers everywhere gave a feeling of security. We are in a different Japan and feel that we are wanted. People are free to express themselves and are glad the coming of American brought freedom of religion. Of course, there may be some people who feel differently, but we have not met them."

Japs Appreciative

"The Japanese are very appreciative as to what America has done for them; a dentist refused to accept pay for filling my tooth because he feels he cannot charge American who have helped them so much."

Travelling by train is almost impossible because soldiers fill the cars but we have visited Mt. Fuji and the Nikko temples by car.

"We were fortunate to get our unimpaired mission property back although the buildings were in very poor condition. We are finding some very sincere students in our co-education — unheard of heretofore — college and hope to encourage leaders among them. The hospital opened in November and nurses' classes will soon begin. We are proud of our nurses who bravely stayed by the wounded throughout the war."

Says Missions Pay

"We often are asked whether missions 'pay.' We say yes and believe if we had done more there might not have been war."

"There are many new homes and little gardens in the acres and acres of homes destroyed. Everywhere things are rationed but Americans do get more of what there is because there is the Japanese ration and the foreign ration. Soon there is to be a commissary where we can get American foods. Clothing is impossible to buy."

"We would be glad to have sons of our Salem friends visit us; we can give them a touch of home as we have several boys and we would like to hear from our friends."

Perimeter Parking, Bus Shuttle Backed

SEATTLE, Jan. 13 (AP)—The best solution to big city traffic congestion, a New York transit authority said Monday, is a system of perimeter automobile parking lots at edges of business districts, with connecting bus service to downtown areas.

Guy C. Hecker, New York City, executive manager of the American Transit association, described this method at a meeting here of Pacific northwest members of the association.

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
