

Water Control District Aired At Evergreen

EVERGREEN, Jan. 21.—Landowners of this area gathered at Evergreen school tonight to attend the 11th meeting called to discuss the proposed Pudding River water control district. The final meeting will be held Monday at North Howell school, 8 p. m.

Manton Carl of Hubbard was chairman of the evening, and introduced Peery Buren, Salem attorney, who explained the law providing for the creation of these districts for irrigation, drainage or flood control. He said that should the district be created, a board of nine directors, landowners in the district, will be elected and this board will have power to levy an ad valorem tax not to exceed 2 per cent in addition to power to make assessments for preliminary work, construction, maintenance, operation and improvements.

Carl said that a first petition, asking that this district be created, had been filed with the county court. The first hearing will be held January 28 at 10 p. m. in the county court. If the court finds the district will not benefit applicants the matter will be dropped. Carl will file a second petition, asking for a second hearing, prior to the second hearing, asking for an election to permit the residents of the proposed district to decide for or against its creation.

Carl also explained that several farmers had signed the original petition requesting a district formation with the understanding that the district would have power only to negotiate with the federal government for a \$110,000 grant for river clearance.

The proposed district, including 48,000 acres, reaches from the mouth of Pudding river, to Labish Center on south to Pratum, east to Centerview, north to Evergreen and Bethany, through Hazel Dell to Aurora.

Previous meetings have been held at Aurora, Whiskey Hill, Union, McKee, Parkersville, Hazel Dell, Bethany, Central Howell and Pratum.
