Driver Blames Girl in Accident

Blame for an accident in which Norma Jean Jones, Salem route 4, was injured last August, was directed at Norma Jean in an answer to a suit, filed in Marion county circuit court Wednesday by defendants, Mr. and Mrs. James Mann of Freewater.

The girl is charged in the answer with operating her bicycle in a negligent manner at the time of the accident which occurred on 99E just south of the 12th street junction. The suit was instituted by Clyde J. Jones, Norma Jean's father, and seeks a total of \$20,500 for injuries supposedly suffered by the girl.

Mann, who was driving the auto at the time of the collision, alleges in his answer that the girl suddenly and unexpectedly, without giving any signal, turned her bicycle in front of his car. He also alleged that the bicycle was not being operated on the correct side of the highway and that she failed to maintain a proper look-out.

Henry Poisel 'Spry as Ever' At 91 Years

Henry Poisel, 1890 Market st., will celebrate his 91st birthday anniversary Friday, but when The Statesman called Wednesday night to inquire about his health his wife said, "Oh, he's out at a lodge meeting tonight."

Mrs. Poisel said he was feeling "just fine and thinks he's as healthy as he ever was. He still does all the work around the house and mows our lawn and a neighbor's besides."

She explained that Poisel goes to the Oddfellows lodge nearly every week. "Henry has been a member for 71 years," she said. "He was initiated by his father, Peter Poisel, noble grand of the Oddfellows in Iowa at that time, in Clarksville, Ia."

Poisel was born in Charlestown, W. Va., in 1857, but was raised in Iowa. In 1900 he and his wife, Alice, resigned their positions at a boys reformatory and came to Oregon. Salem was one of their stops and they settled here because they liked it.

Poisel operated a grocery store at Miller and Commercial streets and a prune orchard near Salem for many years before retiring. He was the first secretary of the Salem Board of Trade, forerunner to the Chamber of Commerce.

Invitations to Execution Sent

Newspaper correspondents along with official witnesses received black-bordered invitations Wednesday to the execution of Wardell H. Henderson, 27-year-old negro, slated for 3:30 a. m. Friday in the lethal gas chamber at the state penitentiary.

The invitations were sent out by Prison Warden George Alexander. Wardell was convicted of first-degree murder in connection with the slaying of Walter Poole, Vanport butcher, on the night of Dec. 24, 1946.

Alexander said Henderson remained in the main cell block Friday and continued in good spirits. He will be transferred to a death cell, adjacent to the execution chamber, Thursday afternoon.
