Has Bean

Legumes Help Family Budgeter Who Must Trim Down Household Expenses

When the budget's looking lean Then we turn to the navy bean. It's pretty corny we'll admit but there's no reason why the housewife can't have a slogan when everyone else does. The Navy bean isn't the only one which will aid in reducing the budget however, for there are the lima, kidney and other beans and their first cousins the lentil and split pea.

The legume family does often come to the fore when budgets are to be pared, and if ever paring the budget was in fashion, it certainly is now.

First let's look at a recipe for baked navy beans, a good bet for the family at least once every two months.

BAKED BEANS

- 2 cups navy beans
- piece of salt pork
- 1 tablespoon brown sugar
- 2 tablespoons molasses
- 1/4 teaspoon dry mustard
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 small onion
- dash of pepper

Soak beans overnight. Parboil in same water until tender. Put into a baking dish or bean pot add browned salt pork, onions and seasonings. Put into 325 to 350 degree oven and bake until done, three hours or longer, adding more moisture if necessary.

Then there are lima beans:

LIMA BEAN LOAF

- 2 cups cooked dried lima beans
- 1 tablespoon chopped green pepper
- 1 tablespoon chopped parsley
- 1/4 cup chopped onion
- 2 eggs, well beaten
- 1/2 cup thin cream or milk
- 2 tablespoons melted fat
- 1 cup bread crumbs
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1 bay leaf
- 3 whole cloves

Mash beans, add other ingredients and combine thoroughly. Turn into oiled loaf pan, place clove and bay leaf on top. Bake in moderate oven (350°F.) one hour, basting with meat stock or hot water in which a little butter has been melted. Serve hot.
