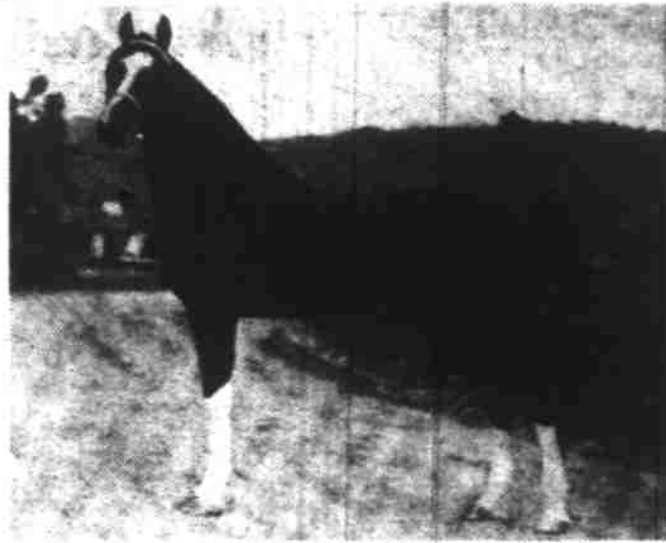


Famed Horse in Salem

This is Rifnas, one of Salem's newest residents, who was sent here by the U. S. Army's remount service and is in charge of A. J. Edwards, Salem civilian agent for the service.



Stallion from Kellogg Team Sent by Army

Rifnas, noted Kellogg Arabian stallion, has arrived in Salem, on consignment of Maj. C. B. Team, officer in charge of the army's western remount area, to A. J. Edwards, 1160 Waller st., who has headed the Salem remount agency since its inception 12 years ago.

The flashily marked Arabian stallion is replacing Laurence M., the government-owned thoroughbred who has been here for eight years.

Rifnas is described as standing 15½ hands high, weighing 1,000 pounds, and as a "horse with substance, yet a fine Arabian type." He was a leader in the widely exhibited Kellogg Arabian horse drill team and appeared at the state fair in Salem in 1935.

Edwards said Wednesday the stallion had won many awards both in performance and in hand classes, and that he was one of the foundation stallions donated to the U. S. government by the University of California, Kellogg Institute for Animal Husbandry, in 1943.

Rifnas' sire, Nasik, and Dam, Rifla, were imported from Lady Wentworth, Crabbet Park, England.

Rifnas is the third Arabian stallion to be assigned by the army to Salem. The first was Stamboul, from the stock of the Oregon cartoonist, Homer Davenport, which sired more than 400 colts in this area.

Edwards said that through the interest created by the army horse-breeding program Oregon has become a noted center for fine Arabian blood stock.

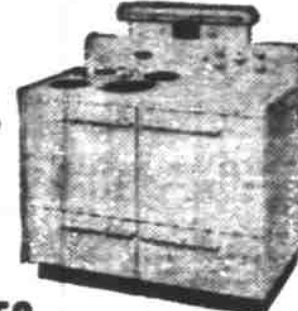
