Woodburn to Get New Firms In Near Future

WOODBURN — Business changes and prospects for new firms were in the offing for this community during the past few weeks, evidenced by announcements made recently for a new bank and new theatre as well as changes in management for a florist shop. The new bank, for which application was filed last week by G. T. Wadsworth and four others associated with him in the Gervais State bank, will be known as the "Bank of Oregon" and will be located in or adjacent to Woodburn. Wadsworth stated that the proposed bank would in no way affect present banking facilities in Gervais. Other signatures on the application are R. V. Colby, L. M. Wadsworth, Helen Hiller and H. G. Wadsworth. The proposed capital stock of the local bank would be \$25,000 with an additional amount paid in of \$10,000.

Property for construction of a new theatre building in Woodburn was purchased this week by a Portland man, according to Earl Dunn, local realtor. The property purchased is located on Young street and the purchaser plans to put up a theatre to seat 500 people, states Dunn. He said that he was not at liberty to release the name of the Portlander but declared the definite plans on the proposed new theatre would be made public shortly. Dunn said that the purchaser of the property is now conducting a number of theatres in Washington and that he plans to make his home in Woodburn and will start construction just as soon as he can get clearance for materials.
