

Power Failure Closes Mills

A generator failure in northern California reverberated far northward in Oregon Wednesday, forcing a score of lumber mills to close because of a lack of electric power.

The power shortage, first felt in the Klamath basin and in northern California yesterday, spread as far north as Eugene, Oregon. A thousand mill workers in Lane county were idled, as all but three of Springfield's sawmills stopped running.

18 Reservists Set for 2-Week Pacific Cruise

Eighteen members of Salem's organized navy reserve will leave Seattle February 29 for a two-week training cruise on the USS Gilligan, Lt. Cmdr. Vernon Gilmore, unit commander, announced Wednesday night.

Ten Salem men going on the destroyer escort are CEM Melbert E. Clemens, BM2 Wilmer Page, MM2 Charles W. Rowan, RM2 Eugene M. Jarvis, CM1 Bernard K. Wodzewska, SI John A. Voves, AS Harry P. Ruhle, AS Adam S. Mack, both of Aumsville; AS Richard D. Nienke, West Stayton, and AS William E. Mertz, Stayton.

The cruise will be an all-reserve affair. Liberty port will be San Francisco, where all hands will have three days ashore, Gilmore said.

Gilmore also revealed that CEM C. W. Flynn, Sheridan, local reserve member, will leave Salem February 13 for Seattle to board a navy transport plane for San Francisco, where he will attend a two-weeks training period connected with the naval reserve program.

The reserve will meet at the Salem airport tonight at 7:30 o'clock for its weekly training session.

Irish Swarm To Election

DUBLIN, Feb. 4—(AP)—The Irish in great numbers voted today for a new parliament. The dominant issue was whether to oust Prime Minister Eamon De Valera from the power he has held for 16 years.

Many politicians saw in the unusually heavy vote a sign that the Fianna Fail leader may lose his majority. De Valera has declared he will resign if his party fails to secure the 74 seats necessary for a majority. He has declared he would refuse to form a coalition government with other parties.

Conclusive results are not expected before Friday.

Commies Threaten Chinese Rail City

PEIPING, Feb. 4—(AP)—Chinese communists threatened today to topple a big government base south of Mukden before fresh nationalist troops sent to Manchuria can get into action.

The base is Chinchien, 140 miles southwest of Mukden on the railway to Peiping. The government is trying to reopen the railway and get troops to Mukden for a counter-offensive this spring.

Press dispatches said strong communist attacks had carried to within three miles of Chinchien.

GOP Demands \$2.5 Billion Cut in Budget

WASHINGTON, Feb. 4—(AP)—Fiscal leaders in the republican-dominated congress demanded today that at least \$2,500,000,000 be saved off President Truman's \$39,700,000,000 spending program for next year.

A \$2,600,000,000 payment on the national debt—which is almost a hundred times that large—also was recommended.

And some senate republicans were talking of putting off any tax reduction until July 1. The \$6,500,000,000 tax cutting bill passed by the house Monday would carry the reduction back to January 1.

The cut in spending was recommended by a 20-member subcommittee of the joint budget committee which is made up of members of the four big money-handling committees of the senate. The full 102-member joint committee is supposed to have its budget recommendations ready for congress by February 15 each year.

The subcommittee calculated that tax receipts will amount to \$47,300,000,000.

The subcommittee did not decide where the budget cuts will be made. That is up to the appropriation committees.

Portland Police Check Man's Death

PORTLAND, Feb. 4—(AP)—The coroner's office reported tonight an autopsy on the body of David Crockett, 33, indicated traces of cyanide and police said they would investigate the young man's sudden death.

Detective D. E. Anderson said Mrs. Myrtle M. Crockett, the widow, told of her husband drinking at their apartment, and slumping in his chair after swallowing a "cloudy chaser."

Police said an empty container, found among discarded garbage at the apartment, also contained a trace of cyanide and led to the autopsy.

County Probes 4 Burglaries; Schools Lose

The Marion county sheriff's office today is continuing an investigation into four burglaries which occurred Friday night in Stayton, Aumsville and Tindor.

Approximately \$330 in cash was taken from Stayton high school when it was entered through a jimmed back door, Sheriff Denver Young said. The money included student body funds and receipts of a Tuesday night basketball game. Several locked inside doors also were jimmed, Sheriff Young said, but nothing else was taken.

Also ransacked the same night were the Aumsville and Turner high school buildings and the Turner Memorial home. Nothing was taken, the sheriff reported.

The Aumsville school was entered through an unlocked basement window, the Turner school apparently through an unhooked ground-floor window, and the memorial home through a jimmed window.

The principal's office desk was ransacked in the Aumsville school and strong box jimmed, but not taken, at the memorial home. No suspects were indicated Wednesday by Sheriff Young, who investigated the entries Wednesday morning with a deputy and state police.

Fund-Holding Threat Posed From South

WASHINGTON, Feb. 4—(AP)—Dixie states may hold out on their contributions to the party's campaign funds, two southern senators indicated tonight.

They posed this new threat to party harmony as the rebellion mounted against President Truman's civil rights program.

Senator McClellan (D-Ark.) suggested proceeds of the Jackson day dinner at Little Rock February 19 be "frozen" until "we get some satisfaction out of the national committee."

Senator Ellender (D-La.) also told a reporter the president's policy "is sure to have considerable effect on the amount of contributions." He added an effect has been noted already "and it is not very encouraging to say the least."

Rep. Trimble (D-Ark.) called it "the same old row within the democratic party which occurred every presidential election year since I can remember."

India Outlaws Violence Cult

NEW DELHI, Feb. 4—(AP)—The government outlawed the RSS tonight and began one of India's greatest manhunts for conspirators in the assassination of Mahatmas Gandhi.

A communiqué said the RSS' "cult of violence has claimed many victims, latest and most precious being Gandhi, himself." RSS stands for Rashtriya Swayam Sevak Sangh (National Volunteer corps).

High police officials said a mass roundup of persons prominent in RSS and another military Hindu organization, Mahasabha, already had begun. They estimated that 700 or 800 would be arrested throughout the country. Estimates of the number already seized ranged from 300 to 500.

Earl of Derby Passes at 82

PRESCOT, England, Feb. 4—(AP)—The Earl of Derby, 82, former cabinet minister and one of the world's prominent sportsmen, died in his sleep at his country home here today.

Lord Derby was secretary for war under David Lloyd George during the first world war and British ambassador to France.

He was best known, however, for his association with the English derby, the great horse racing classic which was named for his family. For nearly a half century he owned and bred some of the world's best race horses. They won for him over 1,000 races with nearly \$3,340,000 in prizes.

Report of U.N. Puts Onus on Dollar Crisis

LAKE SUCCESS, Feb. 4—(AP)—The United Nations published its first big survey on world economic conditions tonight, but important data on Russia was conspicuously lacking.

The 257-page report compiled by the U. N. department of economic affairs contained these major conclusions:

1. Food shortage continued to be the world's top economic problem.

2. The United States is the only big power exporting more goods than it is importing.

3. Inflationary price movements threaten to "destroy the progress already achieved" in European recovery.

4. "Concerted national actions" are needed to keep down prices of goods going into foreign trade.

One of the major difficulties in world recovery, the report said, was the "dollar crisis." It was this "crisis" which led to the Marshall plan.

A Soviet production report, which arrived too late for inclusion, said Russia's economic production is back to pre-war levels.

Third Auto's Plunge Fatal

REEDSPORT, Ore., Feb. 4—(AP)—The body of Archibald Thurber, 58, of Bandon, was recovered tonight from the Umpqua river when his automobile was raised from a deep river pool.

Thurber was the second drowning victim of three highway mishaps in which cars had plunged into the river near the same point in three days.

Police said another motorist saw the lights of Thurber's car swerve away from the road last night and abruptly vanish. Coast guardsmen and police worked to grapple for the car last night and today.

In the other mishaps, K. J. McGuire, Reedspoint, had drowned late Saturday and on Sunday five persons had escaped from a car that submerged a half mile from where Thurber's car was recovered.

A house curfew was imposed on the mixed Arab-Jewish township of Tiberias, on the western shores of Galilee. The curfew will last from 8 a.m. tomorrow until further notice.

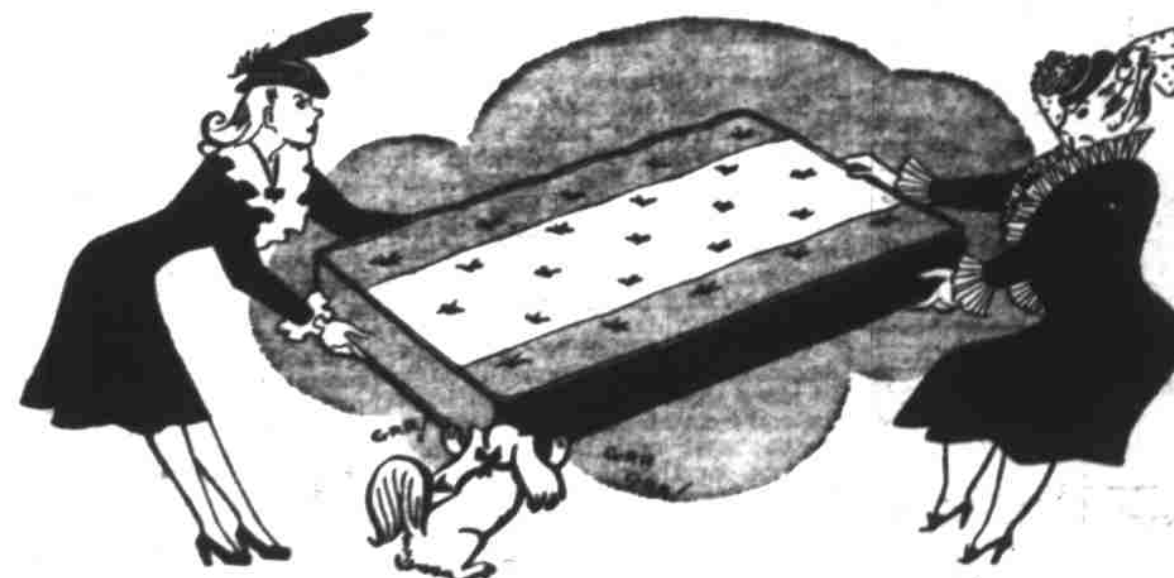
