February Holidays Feature Handy Color for Housewives to Use in Menus

These February holidays, Lincoln's birthday, Valentine's Day and Washington's birthday conveniently provide a good color for use in decorations and food. Red lends itself to flowers, fruits, vegetables and artificially colored foods of several kinds.

By just carrying out a color scheme, the homemaker can produce a festive meal for the family without any extra work at all. Here are some foods which you might like to be reminded of, as producers of colorful foods for this month's special meals:

Cherries, to be made into pies or tarts, to top salads, to be used

in sauce for sundaes or to decorate cakes.

Cranberries, to be jelled (or bought in cans already jelled) and cut into heart shapes, diamonds or in rounds for garnishing the meat platter, salad bowl or to be

served to accompany the main dish.

Red gelatine is handy to use as salad and be flavored with cherries or any other fruit or red vegetable. Gelatine in red color makes a festive dessert, can be used to garnish the meat platter and may be the chief dish for company "dessert" in the evening.

Cut into heart shapes (usually the woman of the house has a heart shaped cutter in her set of diamond-club-spade combination). Gelatine can be used for Valentines day. In circles to simulate cherries and provided with a piece of green for stem it takes on a Washingtonian flavor.

There's less choice in red vegetables, beets and tomatoes providing about all the variety possible right now. Beets make nice salads when served either cooked or raw.
