Defy the High Cost

Ground Beef, Served with Interesting Sauce Is High in Quality at Low Cost

We've found that a pound of ground beef does more to bolster up the sinking spirits of the woman who finds it necessary to cut the budget (and what woman doesn't) than any other item at the meet man's.

A quarter's worth of ground beef, with an egg, some cracker meal or breadcrumbs and chopped servings of meat for a small fam-

A half pound of ground beef and when served with a nice sauce, produces a main dish to be proud of.

Ground beef goes into wilted

cabbage leaves and is cooked make another nice dish. But what about a sauce for the cakes or hamburger? Here are two to remember:

TOMATO SAUCE Yield: 11/2 cups sauce.

2 tablespoons fat 1/2 cup chopped celery cup minced onion

21/2 cups tomatoes 2 teaspoons sugar 1 teaspoon pepper 1 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon ground alispice clove garlic 1 tablespoon flour

Melt fat in skillit. Add celery and onion and saute until tender and golden brown. Add tomatoes and seasonings. Split garlic clove and add. Simmer for 20 minutes. Strain. Add small amount of tomatoes to flour to make smooth pasts. Remove garlic and without straining stir thickening into straining stir thickening into straining stir thickening into sauce and cook 3 to 4 minutes, until smooth and thickened, stirring

constantly. Serve hot. Variation: Cook ground beef patties in the sauce after seasonngs have been added.

ONION SAUCE

Yield: 11/2 cups sauce 1 tablespoon fat 1 cup sliced onion

cup brown stock or bouillon tablespoon flour

Melt fat in skillet. Add onion and cook slowly until tender and golden brown. Add stock and simmer about 5 minutes. Add small amount of liquid to flour to make smooth paste. Stir into remaining stock and cook 3 to 4 minutes until thick and smooth, stirring constantly. Serve hot.
