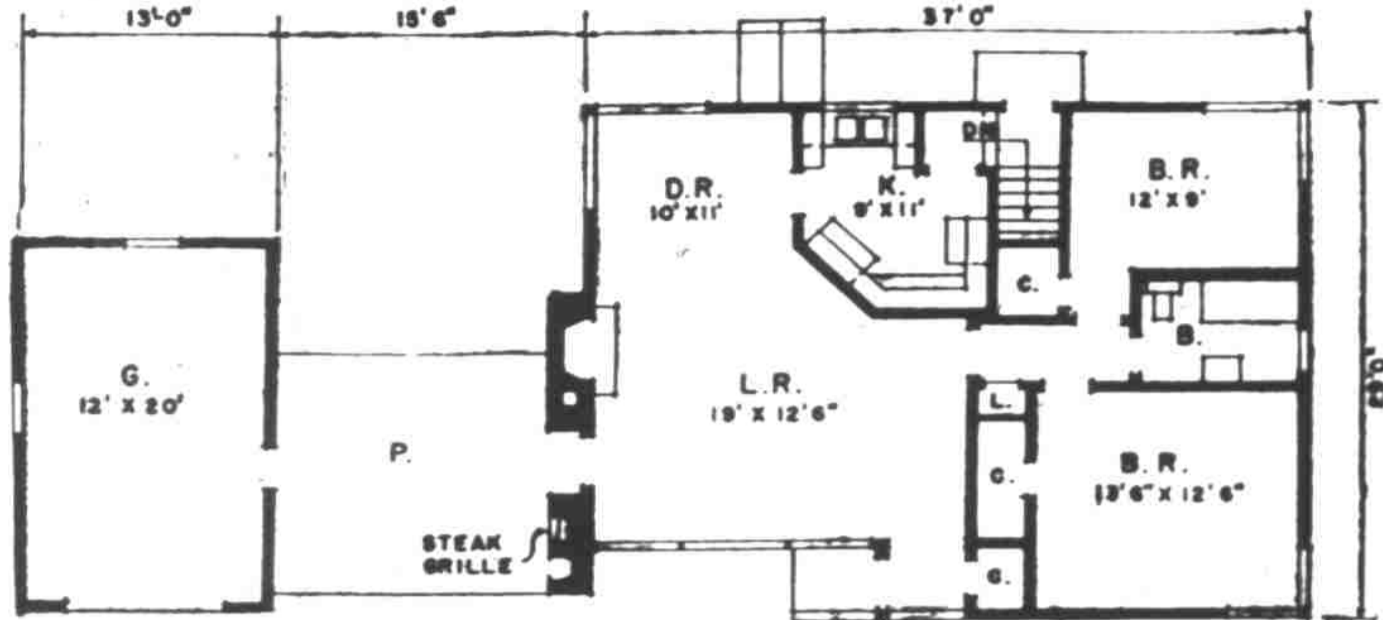

A rambling house with square plan economy, this design 5R-20 by Elmer Grilleck, 120 1/2 So. Grove Ave., Elgin, Ill., offers the low roof lines of the popular ranch house style. A steak grill on the breezeway porch is an interesting detail. The door to the porch is through the massive stone chimney. Open plan for living room and dining room creates a spacious area for entertaining. With full basement, this house contains 19,000 cubic feet, exclusive of garage. The architect suggests forced warm air, or forced hot water heat, exterior walls of wood siding and a roof of wood or asphalt shingles.
