Births, Deaths Lag Behind 1947 Figure

Births and deaths in Marion county so far this year have lagged behind the comparable period in 1947, but activities of the county health department surged ahead, according to reports made Thursday at the county health board's meeting.

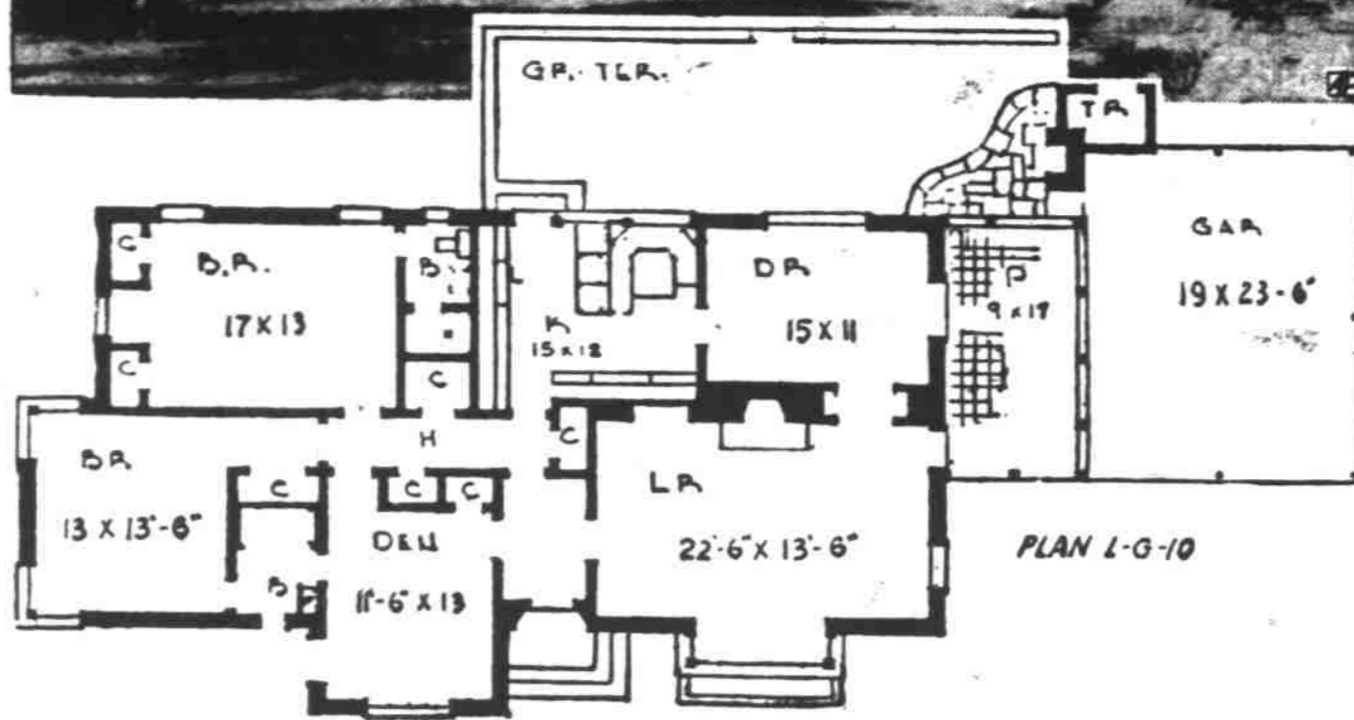
February's 188 births, 93 boys and 95 girls, brought 1948's total to 338, as compared with 470 in the first two months of 1947. The month's 52 deaths put the total at 132, compared with 141 last year. Heart disease continued to lead as a cause of death, with 18 such fatalities during February, followed by cancer with six.

For the first two months the health department handled 80 instances of rodent control compared to last year's 5; sanitation interviews, 86 and 25; registration of foodhandling establishments, 106 and 14; field visits to such establishments, 549 and 214; whooping cough immunizations, 163 and 158.

New cases of communicable diseases reported during February included chickenpox 10, influenza 43, typhoid 16, undulant fever 4, syphilis 4, gonorrhea 3 and ringworm 5. The only death caused by a communicable disease was by Hodgkin's disease.

The number of U. S. telephones in use increased from 6.1 million in 1907 to 26.4 million in 1944.

'Home-of-the-Week'



A rambling cottage of six rooms planned for privacy and convenience. This design, L-G-10, is the work of Henry Sprott Long and James L. Gatling, Jr., architects, Frank Nelson Building, Birmingham 3, Ala. The house covers about 1,600 square feet exclusive of porch and garage. To get the morning sun in kitchen and dining room and give the living room a south-western exposure this plan would be most suitable for the east side of a north-south street. A center hall layout makes it possible to go to any one of the bedrooms, kitchen or living room, without passing through another room. A grass terrace at the rear has a barbecue fireplace adjoining a tool room for garden implements. Access to the screened porch is afforded from both living room and dining room. The architects suggest brick veneered frame construction with a gas fired warm air heating system hung below the floor joists. There are two baths.

Services for Henry Poisel Held Thursday

Funeral services for Henry S. Poisel, 91, former teacher and grocer who died at his home, 1890 Market st., Wednesday, were held from the Clough-Barrick chapel on Thursday afternoon.

Poisel was born in Virginia Jan. 23, 1857, and moved to Iowa with his parents when a youth. He was married to Alice Shaw, who survives, in Clarksville, Ia., in 1887. A short time later he and Mrs. Poisel took teaching positions at the Boys' Industrial school in Eldora, Ia., where he was in charge of shop training.

After 12 years in Eldora, the couple moved to Oregon where they began teaching at the Oregon Boys' Industrial school in Salem in 1900. They remained at the school for four years and took over a 20-acre prune ranch in the Rosedale community.

A year and a half later they moved to Salem and built a house on South Commercial street where they lived for 47 years. For many years Poisel and his brother-in-law, George Shaw, operated a grocery store on South Commercial and Miller streets.

Poisel was the first president of the Salem Board of Trade, later to become the chamber of commerce, and was a member of the First Congregational church and the Odd Fellows lodge.

Surviving besides the widow are a daughter, Margaret Poisel Ohling of Portland, three grandchildren and several nieces and nephews.

New Forest Industries Group To Aid Coordination, Promotion

Formation of a coordinating and promotion group to be known as Associated Forest Industries of Oregon was furthered Thursday with the filing of articles of incorporation in the Marion county clerk's office.

The non-profit corporation's principal office is to be in Salem. Incorporators are H. Stewart Tremaine, John P. Bledsoe and George P. Campbell, all of 808 Pacific building, Portland.

Its purpose is declared to be that of serving "the welfare of the people of Oregon by encouraging, protecting and advancing the interest of Oregon industries; to serve as spokesman for Oregon industries before the public and to strive for a better understanding between industry and the public."

A seven-man board of trustees is to be elected, according to the by-laws from segments including sawmill men west of the Cascade range and those east, a similar division for members in the lumber manufacturing business, and one each from loggers, pulp and paper business and plywood manufacturing. Membership dues vary according to the board fees of lumber producer or used annually.
