New Models Out In Kaiser-Fraser

WILLOW RUN, Mich. — Introduction of 1948 models embodying 35 mechanical and body styling improvements was announced today by Kaiser-Fraser Corp. for the four models in the Kaiser and Frazer series at no price increase.

Of the 35 new model improvements, 25 are mechanical and 10 are in body design and appointment features. Developments include use of a high-compression head on the six-cylinder motor which has raised its compression ratio from 6.86 to 7.30, and is declared to have substantially boosted operating power, performance and economy. An array of 28 body colors and two-tone combinations are offered in the 1948 series.

Police Officers Class Planned

Agencies cooperating include the Portland police bureau, Multnomah county sheriff's office, Bureau of Municipal Research and Service of the University of Oregon and the League of Oregon Cities.

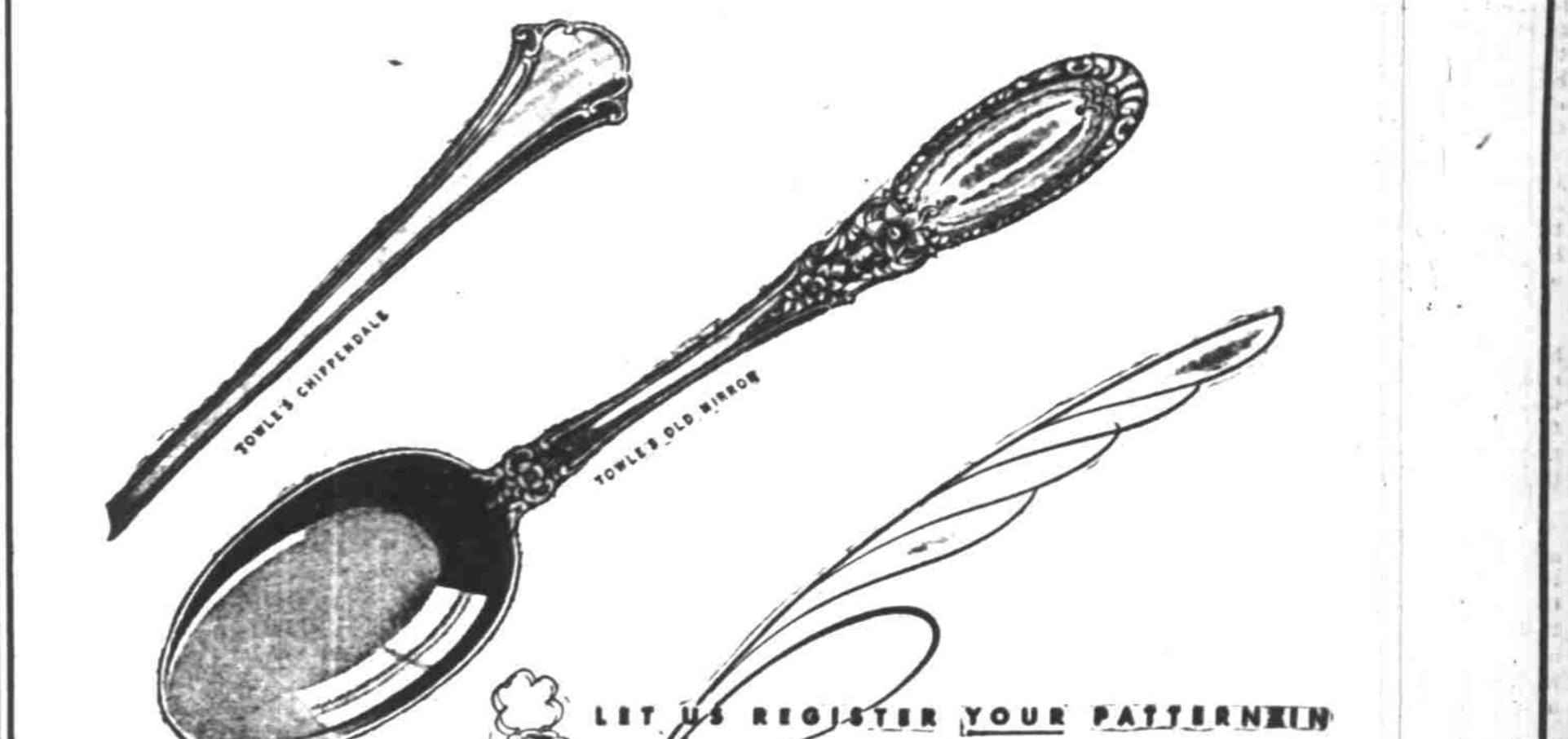

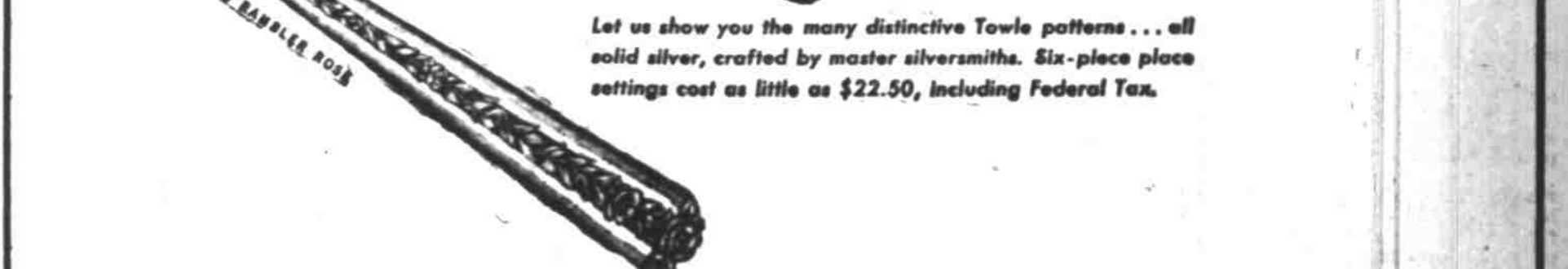
