

## New Zoning Plan Object Of Appeals

SILVERTON — Appearing at a public hearing Monday by the planning commission were Lowell Brown, Earl J. Adams, Mr. and Mrs. Fred Beckhayer and Charles Walker in reference to the adoption of the new Silverton zoning ordinance. Brown and Adams were interested in keeping the industrial zone from encroaching further on residential property on McClaire street, and Beckhayer brought a petition asking that property including that designated as the Blackberry and Golden map be changed to commercial from residential. Walker expressed hope that his might be included in the commercial zone. Recommendations granting these requests will go from the planning commission to the council at the April meeting.

R. Holstrom appeared before the commission to ask for improvement on First street. City Manager Robert Horland reported petitions had been completed and everything was in readiness to proceed with this as soon as the city council acts, and the commission recommended action be taken at the earliest possible date.

Action against the city dump ground is pending and the commission recommended that an incinerator be built on the dump ground abandoned at the earliest possible time, and that the incinerator be made available to the public.

A. O. Nelson, member of the commission, brought to the matter of the proposed city ordinance setting rules for calling special council meetings and asked that the commission members oppose this. As minutes of the city council showed this ordinance had been supported by the majority of the council on its first two readings, and commission members felt that it was out of their jurisdiction, the matter was tabled.

Nicholas Lalor was born in Denver, and came to Evanston, Wyo. 21 years ago where he was employed by the Union Pacific railroad.

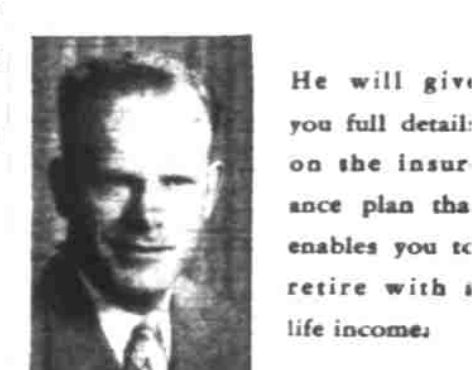
