Kellner came here first as an employe of H. Haaland, who also

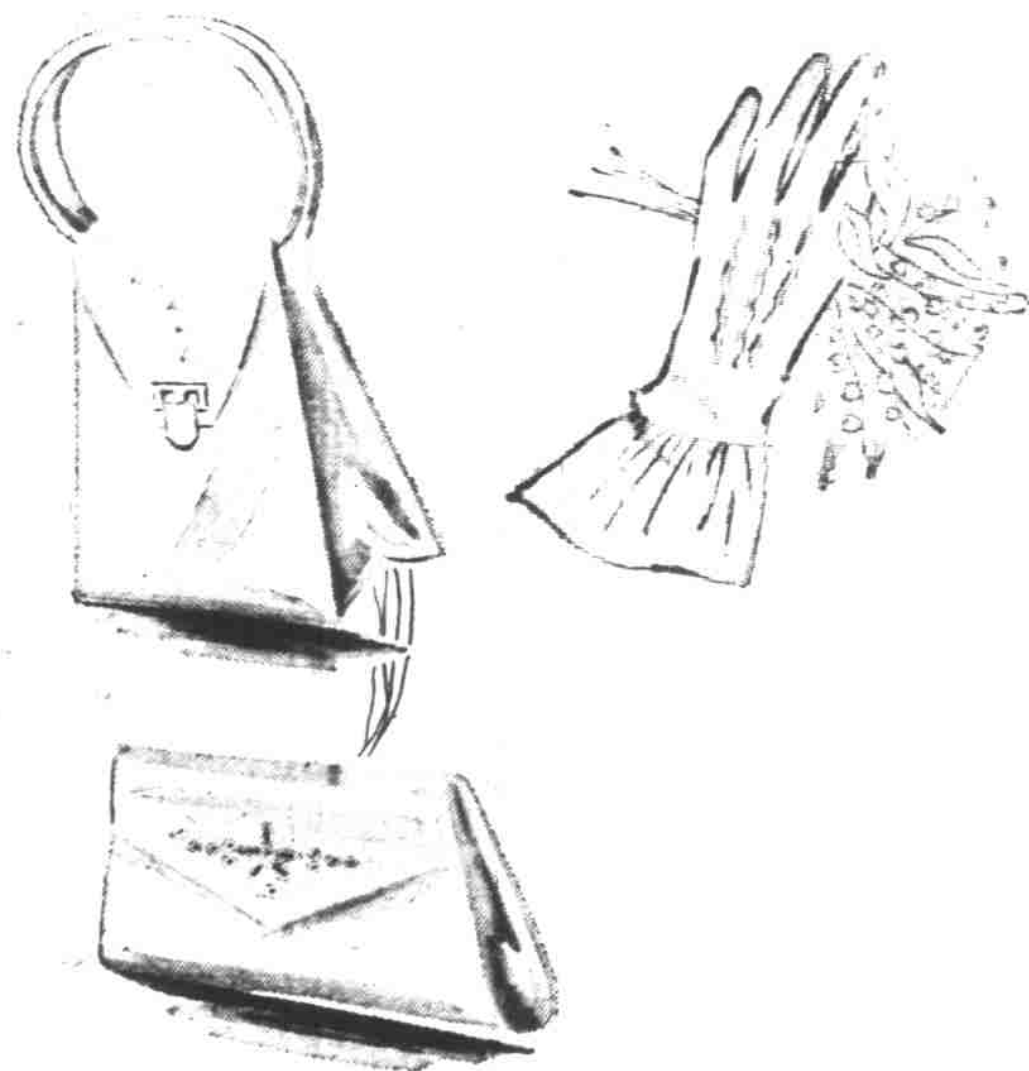
sold his shop a few weeks ago. One who came here from Colorado year later Kellner opened his own shop, at the corner of Oak and First streets, a half block from his present location.
