

Doctors Fly to Operate on Woman in Snowbound Sector

KLAMATH FALLS, March 26—(P)—A 28-year-old farm wife was recovering in her snowbound home today after an emergency operation performed in her kitchen with a ribbed-out door for an operating table.

The operation was done at the remote Steel Swamp ranch yesterday by two physicians who flew there in a ski-equipped plane. They used the kitchen sink and stove for water and heat, elevated the patient's feet with a chunk of stove wood, and pressed the plane pilot into service as an anesthesiologist.

The woman, Mrs. Herman Vowell, was reported in "excellent" condition today. A nurse who flew there and a neighbor farm wife who rode 16 miles through the snow on horseback to proffer aid were attending her.

Mrs. Vowell was stricken with an internal hemorrhage yesterday in her home 30 miles southeast of Malin. Her husband, the ranch foreman, frantically cranked the rural telephone for help.

Dr. Jack Martin, Malin, flew with pilot Bud Arnold in a ski-

equipped plane to land in a snowy meadow near the ranch house. They found the young woman critically ill.

Dr. Martin telephoned another physician, Dr. Raymond Tice of Klamath Falls, to assemble surgical equipment. The plane flew back to Klamath Falls, picked up Tice and the equipment, and returned to the ranch.

Laying the farm wife on a door placed across kitchen tables, the surgeons performed the emergency operation. Pilot Arnold administered the anesthetic.

Later, the pilot flew again to Malin to bring Rachel Gysbers, a nurse, to the ranch. Mrs. Ernest Archer, whose husband is foreman of a 16-mile-distant ranch, rode her horse through the snow to the Steel Swamp ranch for help.

Dr. Tice started homeward late in the night, traveling 50 miles by jeep on a circuitous route through Alturas, Calif., to avoid the heaviest snow. Dr. Martin returned by plane today.

Intense Battle In Costa Rica

SAN JOSE, Costa Rica, March 26—(P)—Heavy fighting developed today at Dominical, on the Pacific coast, in Costa Rica's civil war.

Dominical is approximately 50 miles by air southeast of San Jose. Government troops established a beachhead there last week to launch an attack on rebel leader Jose Figueres.

Government forces appealed for an ambulance plane and doctors, but later messaged that fighting was so intense that it was unsafe for a plane to land.

China Raids Near Peiping

PEIPING, Saturday, March 27 (P)—Strong communist bands raided points only five and six miles outside of Peiping today.

A battle also appeared to be shaping up 50 rail miles northeast of Peiping. An artillery duel was in progress near Miyun, railway control point on the road from Peiping to Jehol province.

The raids near Peiping have gone almost unnoticed in the past, but the newspapers were taking note of them now. Two thousand red guerrillas were reported six miles east of Peiping. Another band of 1,000 was reported active five miles northwest of the city.

HILLSBORO, Ore., March 26—(P)—Hillsboro voted 335 to 87 today for an \$85,000 bond issue to finance a new fire station here.

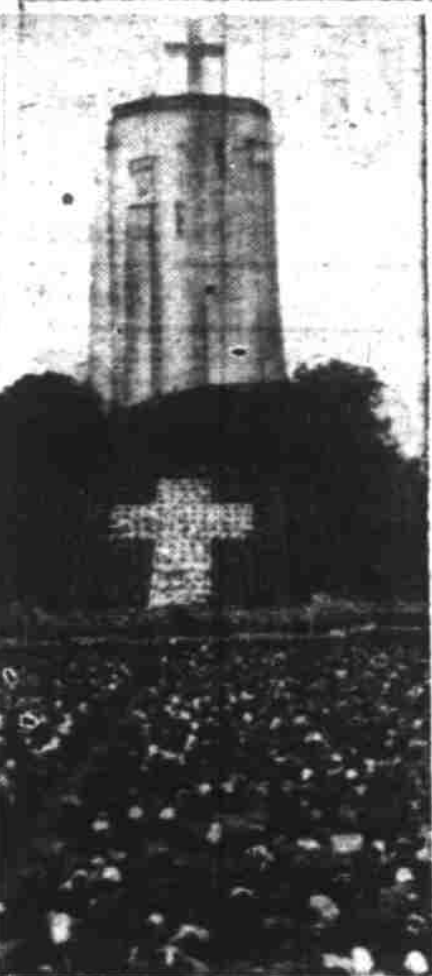

U.S. Avers Russ Concentration Camps Filling

WASHINGTON, March 26—(P)—The United States accused Russia tonight of restoring concentration camps to eastern Germany and filling them with opponents of its "new totalitarianism" there.

Further, the American government charged in a note sent to the Soviet embassy that Russia and its eastern European satellites—not the western powers—are responsible for dividing Germany and splitting the whole of Europe between east and west.

The American note, signed by Assistant Secretary of State Norman Armour and addressed to Soviet Ambassador Alexander S. Panyushkin, was delivered to the embassy and released by the state department tonight.
