City Election Ballot Drafted

City Recorder Alfred Mundt Wednesday posted in his city hall office official drafts of city ballots for the May 21 election and official notice of the special annexation election on the same date.

The proposed annexation of territory southeast of the city must be approved by both the city electorate, balloting at regular precinct polling places, and residents of the annexation area who will vote in the new Walling building at 1415 E. Hoyt st.

The city election coincides with state primary elections.

All city issues, including annexation, will appear on one ballot, with candidates for city posts numbered from 12 through 22 (R. L. Elfstrom, unopposed for mayor, through Alvin Tungate, a ward 7 alderman candidate opposing incumbent Howard M. Plett). In the \$815,000 sewer bond issue section, the line for vote favorable to the charter amendment is numbered 100 and the line against the amendment 101.

The court, which had refused to take over the road last year because it was a dead-end, told the petitioners Wednesday that the road still lacked sufficient requirements for it to be acquired by the county.

The group informed the court yesterday that "a right-of-way eliminating the dead-end was available. It was decided to permit the county engineer to make an estimate of the cost of grading and graveling the road."

Lying just north of Brooks, the road is about one-quarter mile long and runs east from highway 99E.
