

Forget About Atomic Power, Scientists Urge

NEW YORK, April 10—(AP)—A group of American scientists urged the United Nations tonight to consider immediately a plan for a world ban on atomic power.

The group director, Cuthbert Daniel, said its plan would mean shutting down the huge atomic

plants at Oak Ridge, Tenn., and Hanford, Wash., as well as any similar plants in operation in any country of the world.

"People would be willing to forget about atomic power if they could only stop worrying about the atomic bomb," Daniel declared at a news conference.

Chinese Claim Major Victory

PEIPING, Sunday, April 11—(AP)—Government headquarters asserted today that Chinese troops had won a major victory in a comeback campaign in Inner Mongolia.

It said government troops had recaptured Liangcheng, regarded as the gateway to the government stronghold of Kweisui, capital of the Inner Mongolian province of Suiyuan.

Kweisui is reputed to be the objective of a new communist drive in Inner Mongolia. The government never had acknowledged losing Liangcheng, which is 65 miles southeast of Kweisui.

14 Elite Guard Nazis to Hang

NUERNBERG, Germany, April 10—(AP)—An American tribunal today sentenced 14 officers of Adolf Hitler's elite guard to death on the gallows. It was the biggest batch of death sentences ever handed out in a war crimes trial in Germany.

The SS officers commanded roving bands of triggermen who killed a million Jews, communist partisans and Gypsies in the wage of Nazi armies in Poland and Russia. The 14 and seven other officers were found guilty yesterday. Two of the 21 convicted drew life terms and the remaining five were sent to prison for lesser terms ranging down to 10 years.

Program to Spur Uranium-Seekers

WASHINGTON, April 10—(AP)—A three-phase program to stimulate the discovery and production of uranium in this country was announced tonight by the atomic energy commission.

It involves Government guaranteed 10-year minimum prices for domestic refined uranium, high grade uranium ores and mechanical concentrates.

A \$10,000 bonus for the discovery and production of high grade uranium ores from new domestic deposits.

Government guaranteed three-year minimum prices for low grade ore.

Wheat, Flour Exports Raised

WASHINGTON, April 10—(AP)—A 16,000,000 bushel increase in spring wheat and flour exports from the United States gave the European recovery program a flying start today.

The increase is based on forecasts of the third biggest wheat harvest in United States history. Secretary of Agriculture Anderson, announcing the boost as a "firm goal," indicated that a still bigger quota may be set later this month for shipment to food-scarce areas of the world.

Seymour Joins Milling Firm

PORTLAND—H. C. Seymour, former state 4-H club leader of Oregon, has joined the staff of the Triangle Milling company here, it is announced. His services will continue to be available for any 4-H club meetings, chambers of commerce, service clubs, grange meetings, Farmers Unions, and agriculture groups. He will continue to reside in Corvallis.

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Delegates in Nebraska to Back Winner

OMAHA, April 10—(AP)—A large majority of 32 candidates for 15 delegate posts pledged themselves tonight to vote on the first ballot at the republican national convention for the winner of next Tuesday's Nebraska presidential primary.

Some of the prospective delegates—running in the same primary with the presidential candidates—went even further to say they will back Tuesday's vote winner as long as he has a chance to be nominated.

These pledges put some delegate cash in the bank to the outcome of what is regarded here as a three-way race between Harold E. Stassen, Gov. Thomas E. Dewey and Senator Robert A. Taft for the endorsement of Nebraska republicans.

This endorsement carries no official commitment of the delegates. There are four other candidates in the race. Among them Senator Arthur Vandenberg and Gen. Douglas MacArthur appear to have the best possibility of rolling up sizable vote totals.

Carl Warren of California and House Speaker Joseph Martin also are on the ballot.

Commies Absorb Czech Socialists

PRAGUE, April 10—(AP)—Leaders of the social democratic party volunteered today to merge with the communists in a single Marxist working class party.

The step was recommended by the social democrats central committee for final action at the party congress here April 17-18. There was no doubt of the outcome.

Czechoslovakia's one-time balance of power social democratic party was headed for the same fate as the party found in Poland, Romania and Hungary.

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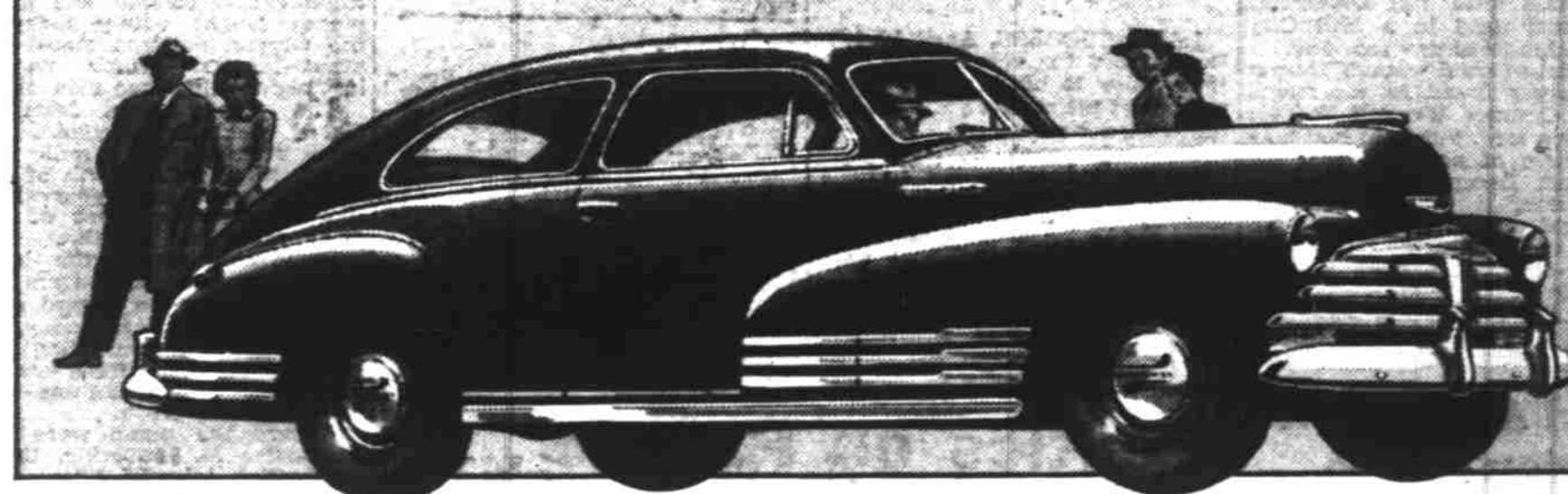
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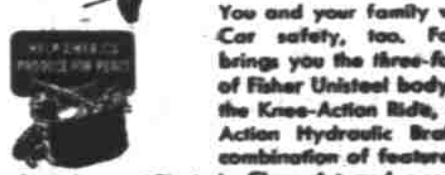
