Marion county schools received \$102,700 when \$1,594,560, representing the second half of the state basic school support fund, was distributed Friday by Secretary of State Earl T. Newbry. The fund is distributed throughout the state to reduce county school tax levies and is apportioned on the basis of \$10 per capita for the number of children between the ages of 4 and 20 years.

Linn county received \$58,785 and Polk county \$32,495, Newbry said.
