

X-Ray Survey To Begin in County Monday

The annual X-ray survey will begin Monday in Marion county and will continue through May 13. X-ray machines slated to visit schools, industries and hospitals.

The free chest X-rays are sponsored by the Marion County Public Health department and the county health association in conjunction with the Oregon Tuberculosis and Health association.

and the state board of health. The survey is endorsed by the Marion-Polk County Medical society.

Any person over 15 years may be X-rayed to determine chest conditions indicating tuberculosis, lung cancer or an enlarged heart. In the county's schools, however, all students will be X-rayed, except in Salem senior high school where junior and senior students only will be taken.

The mobile X-ray machine will return to Salem on May 15 and 17 to take in larger sizes X-rays of persons who were taken earlier and classed as "probables."

Driver Training Course Scheduled For Instructors

Continuing spread of the driver education and training program in Oregon high schools has resulted in the scheduling of a third course for instructors August 23 to 27 in Portland, Secretary of State Earl T. Newby announced Saturday. Approximately 40 Oregon high

schools are now offering the student course, with the number increasing as curriculum time is made available. Under the program, high schools with qualified course instructors are assigned dual control training cars.

The summer course, by which teachers earn three hours of graduate or undergraduate credit credit from the state system of higher education and qualify as in-

structors, will be held at Lincoln high school in Portland. Prof. Amos Neyhart, Pennsylvania State college, and one of the nation's foremost driver training instructors, will conduct the course.
