Boeing Plant Strike Grows

SEATTLE, April 22 (AP)—The strikebound Boeing Airplane company charged today that its 14,800 union employees had "repudiated and cancelled" their collective bargaining agreement.

Meantime, the idle in the strike, which started at 12:30 a. m., swelled to more than 18,000. Among the idle were most of the 3,900 office employees and supervisors.

The strike is the first in the 32-year history of the company.

The union demands which preceded the strike action were for a 30-cent hourly pay increase, eight paid holidays and retention of seniority provisions. The company had offered a 15-cent increase.

Stocks Push to 9 Month High

NEW YORK, April 22 (AP)—A hard-hitting buying drive pushed stock prices today to the highest average level since last July.

Stocks of oil and railroad companies set the pace. Issues of numerous industrial concerns joined the race with gains of a few cents to more than \$2 a share.

Two buying surges helped to swell total volume to 2,330,000 shares, largest since December, 1946. First-hour trading was so rapid that the high-speed ticker tape was too slow to keep up with actual transactions. Again in the final hour a churning market developed.

Brokers named a variety of reasons for the advance. "Bullish public psychology" topped the list.

England, India In Davis Action

HARROGATE, England, April 22 (AP)—England and India split a pair of singles matches today as 1948 Davis Cup tennis got underway.

Twenty-five nations have entered teams in the European phase of the international competition for the trophy now held by the United States. In today's opening match Dilip Bose of India humbled Howard Walton, 6-3, 6-3, 6-2, in a contest which the Briton was expected to win handily.

Nations Agree to Anti-Red Stand

BOGOTA, Colombia, April 22 (AP)—The Pan American conference approved unanimously today a resolution condemning the political methods of international communism.

The resolution, which also condemns other forms of totalitarianism, recommends that each of the 21 participating nations adopt measures to combat communism.

WASHINGTON (AP)—Government tests indicate that pigs heavily infested with parasites such as lungworms and intestinal threadworms need about 0.8 pounds more feed to gain a pound of weight than do pigs not infested.
