

# Demonstrations Draw Crowds To Rotary Club's Hobby Show

The first-night crowd at the Salem Hobby show in the armory Friday evening didn't wait until today's judging to pass approval on and give honors to the widely varied "pastime art" on display. Most attractive to the continual stream of onlookers were the many active demonstrations.

Mingling with the spectators were proud hobbyists who had spent long leisure hours with their crafts or collections. Also proud were the members of Salem Rotary club, sponsors of the show. The first annual. The committee expressed surprise at the multitude of and variety of entries.

Judging will be conducted this morning, and tonight at 7:30 merchandise prizes will be presented to five entries in each division — for the most unusual hobby, originality of display, best working exhibit, best junior exhibit and best senior exhibit.

When the show opens at 1 o'clock this afternoon, the achievement cup for each division, as well as award ribbons, will be in place on the displays.

Youngsters took most of the notice last night in their many exhibits, including a bevy of art students from Salem High school demonstrating painting, block printing and clay modeling. Other students showed woodwork, mechanics, radio craft, model boats, hand-carved nature scenes and Boy Scouts' work.

One of the crowd-stopping demonstrations was that of the Salem Weavers guild operating a hand loom to weave intricate designs. Others included the man who painted landscapes in oil as the crowd watched, and the gem-faceting and polishing of G. McAlister.

Among the examples of intricate and skillful craftwork were Lee Unruh's agates, cut and polished in the shapes of a covered wagon, spinning wheel, wheelbarrow and others; two Fisher Napoleonic coaches entered by Paul Franklin and Wayne Burgess, the platform cradle, rocking between a pair of bunnies.

Appearing on Friday evening's stage program were Wayne Mercer, marimbist, accompanied by Rose Gibbens; Bill Gwinn, baritone, accompanied by Joan Johnson; City Manager J. L. Franzen, Rotary Club president Gardner Knapp and Show Manager R. R. (Bob) Boardman. A roving microphone and loudspeaker to attract attention to the exhibits was operated by Dave Hoss.

The show will be open from 10 to 10 p. m. today and 2 to 5 p. m. Sunday. At 2 p. m. Sunday a group of tribal dances will be presented by students of Chemawa Indian school.

Salem insurance men were hosts to 40 fellow agents of the Willamette valley at the annual regional banquet-meeting of the Oregon State Insurance Agents association Friday night at Nohlgren's restaurant.

Also included in the group were executive committee members of the state association. Homer Smith, jr., Salem insurance agent and president of the Salem association, presided at the meeting. William C. Dyer, jr., Salem, was chairman of the local arrangements committee for the affair.

Discussion at the business meeting centered on trends of increases in liability insurance which, it was pointed out, are due to extremely heavy losses being incurred by companies today. Speakers stressed that the spiral of insurance rates on automobiles is still far below the rising cost of other commodities.

Mrs. DeLespinasse stressed that many modern children now being classed as delinquent or retarded are merely displaced. Another solution to the problem, she suggested, would be the election of more women to legislative posts, pointing out that women generally understand the juvenile problem more readily than men.

Ken Foster, Salem Optimist president, stressed that the club is not merely a social organization but one which is doing youth work. He quoted the Optimist slogan, "Friend of the Boy," and told members they will be called on to direct youth projects in Salem.

# Phone Firm's Zone Change Still Uncertain

City action on the Pacific Telephone & Telegraph Co. request for permission to erect an office building across Winter street from the state library remained uncertain Friday.

The city zoning commission this week postponed voting on its final recommendation to the city council, pending a conference with the Salem long range planning commission and the Oregon chapter of American Institute of Architects. City Manager J. L. Franzen, seeking to arrange the meeting for yesterday, found the architects could not be represented.

No date has been set and it appears unlikely the joint conference will be called before the Salem city council meeting Monday. Although the requested zone change is not yet officially before the council, the aldermen earlier this month anticipated the issue by dispatching a request for recommendations from each of the three groups interested in a new overall zoning plan for the capitol zone district here. The telephone company plan would require a zone change and setback requirement exception for an 84 by 115 foot lot on the corner of Court and Winter streets.

JERUSALEM, April 23 - (AP) - David Ben-Gurion, premier-designate of the Jewish state, declared in a passover broadcast tonight that Jews are bucking on the sword and called upon them to "mobilize all hidden resources of strength, will power, devotion and ability."

The Russian-born Ben Gurion, who also has been designated war minister and commander-in-chief spoke as thousands of Arabs streamed out of Haifa, Palestine's big port, in a self-imposed exodus following Jewish conquest of the city.
