Bankmen See Good Business

Continuance of prosperous business conditions, due to the demand for virtually all lines of commodities and materials, was predicted by speakers at the national convention of state superintendents of banks in Washington, D. C., last week. A. A. Rogers, a head of the Oregon state banking division, reported on his return Monday.

Rogers declared that while there has been some tightening up of credit in certain financial fields total loans for the first three months of 1948 compare favorably with those for the corresponding period a year ago. Of most concern to financial interests, Rogers said, are strikes which have slowed down and curtailed production.

Rogers said virtually every state in the union was represented. A bumper 1948 tourist crop was predicted by all delegates, he added.

Guard Recruit Contest Slated

Plans for the Oregon national guard recruiting contest opening May 1 and concluding June 25 were announced Monday by Adjutant General Thomas E. Rilea. Participants will be both the air and ground units of the guard with awards given the unit showing the greatest net gain in recruits during the period and the enlisted man recruiting the largest number.

The winning unit will receive an article of furniture or recreational equipment, not to exceed \$300 in cost, while the top enlisted man in the recruiting campaign will receive a round trip to San Francisco.

Presentation of awards will be made during the summer field camp June 15 to 29. Ground units of the guard will train at Camp Clatsop and air units at Portland.
