

### Army Re-Signs Robert Quamme

Robert E. Quamme, 228 McNary st., West Salem, World War II veteran and national guard member, re-enlisted in the regular army this week at the Salem recruiting office.

Quamme re-entered the army as a technical sergeant and will train recruits at Fort Ord, Calif. He fought with the famous northwest 41st division in the South Pacific and had been a member of Salem's company B, 162nd infantry battalion, since his discharge from the army.

A graduate of Salem high school in 1936, Quamme also attended Willamette university for one year. He wears the Asiatic-Pacific campaign ribbon. He is married and has two children.

Another veteran enlisting this week was Kenneth R. Clark, 655 Union st., former air force sergeant who re-enlisted in his old branch, Howard R. Reed, Silverton, enlisted in the 1st cavalry division for service in Japan.

### Civil Engineer Positions Open

### Valley Obituaries

#### Margaret Powell

MONMOUTH, April 29—Funeral will be held at the local Christian church at 2 p.m. Friday, for Mrs. Margaret Powell, 77, who died Wednesday at the family farm home between Monmouth and Dallas.

Born Feb. 23, 1871 at Middle Grove, Mo., she attended schools there including Middle Grove Academy. She was married in 1891 at Middle Grove to Perry O. Powell according to County Judge Grant Murphy.

The deed, involving between three and four acres, was received from heirs of the J. R. Cooper estate. It was under title examination Thursday and if correct will probably eliminate the owners from the county's pending condemnation suit. This property includes the larger part of the "cloverleaf" approach.

Leo N. Childs, Henry R. Crawford and County Engineer Hedda Swart, who were appointed to appraise the right-of-way area, are to report to the court today. The suit against owners of needed property will probably be filed Saturday, said Murphy.

An \$845,900 bid for construction of the bridge has met the approval of the state highway commission and Marion and Polk counties, all of which share in the cost. Work is to get underway this summer.

### County Handed Deed to Bridge Approach Land

Receipt of a deed to some of the land needed for approach right-of-way to the proposed bridge at Independence is expected to speed Marion county's action toward securing ownership of right-of-way according to County Judge Grant Murphy.

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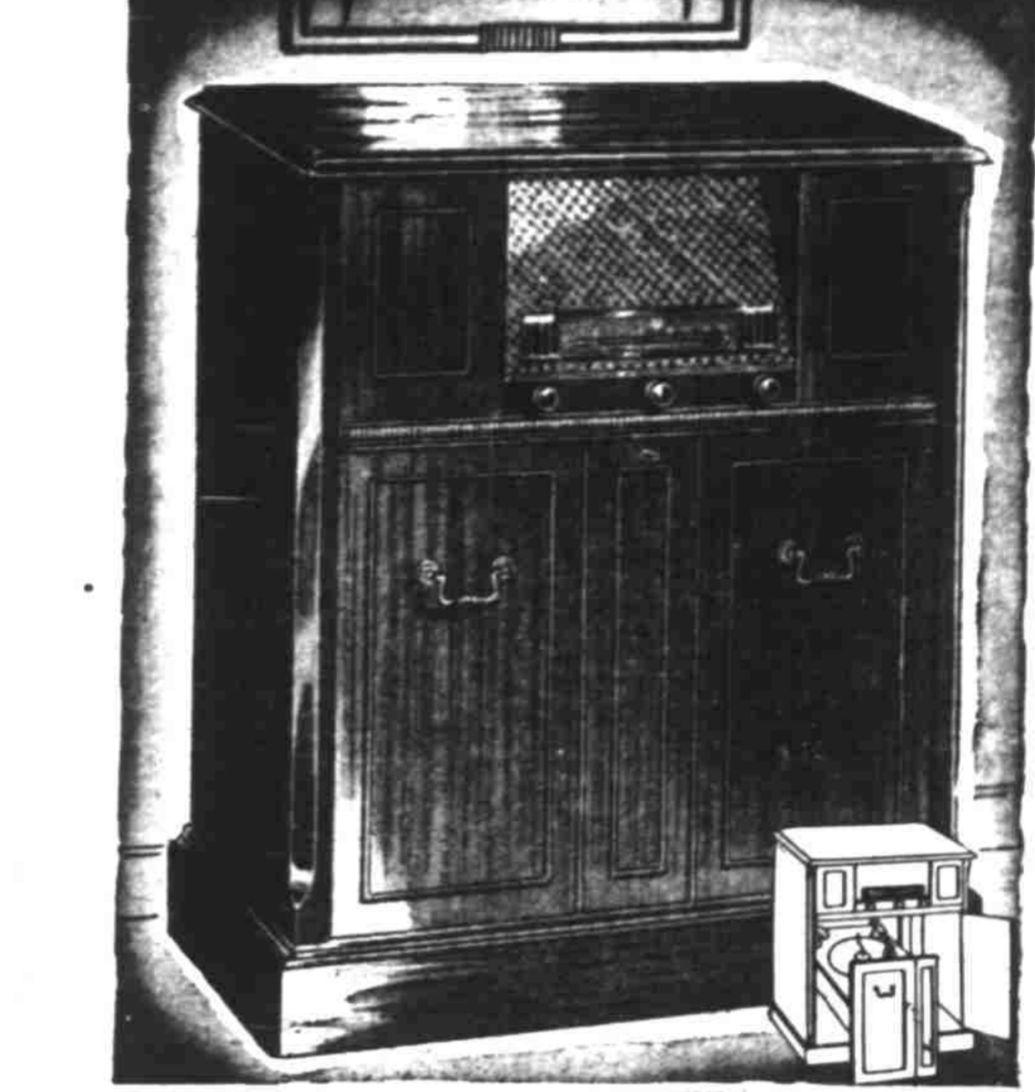

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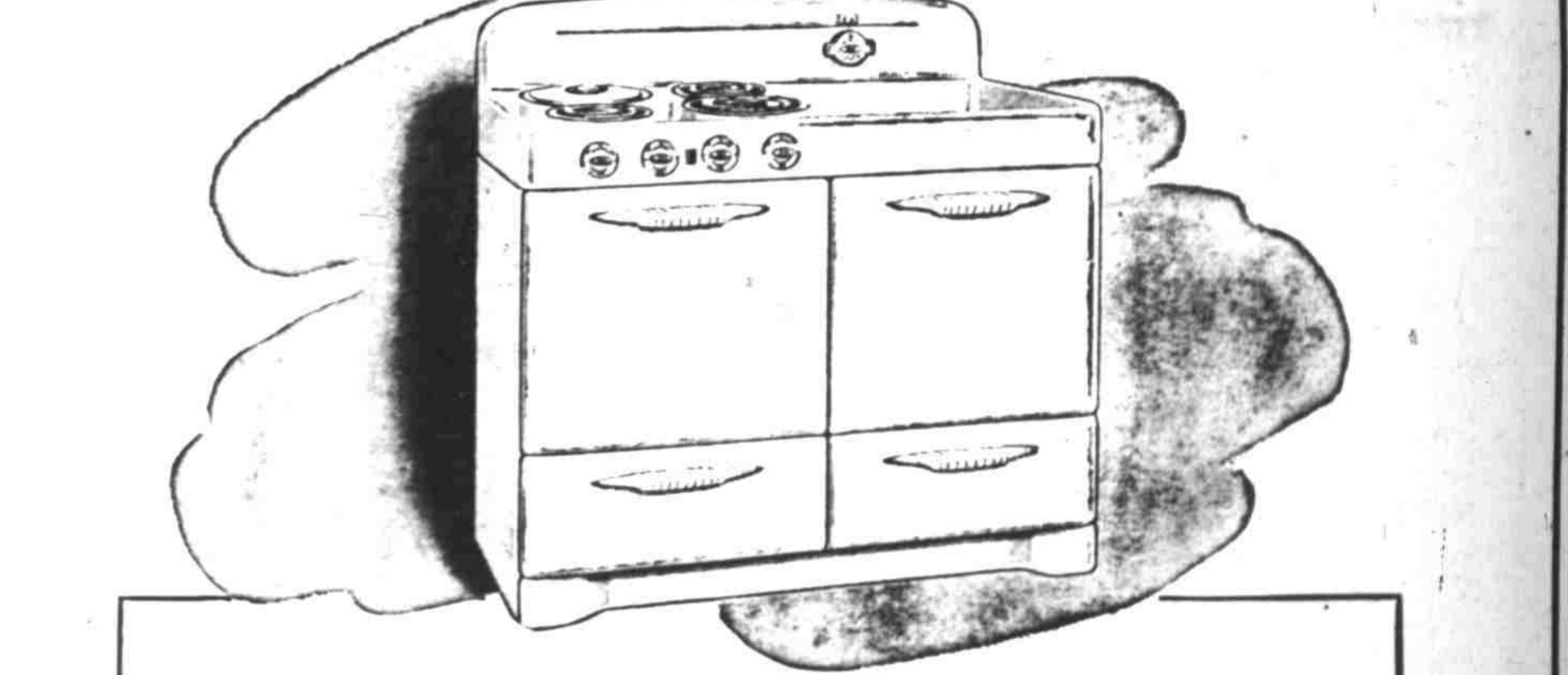

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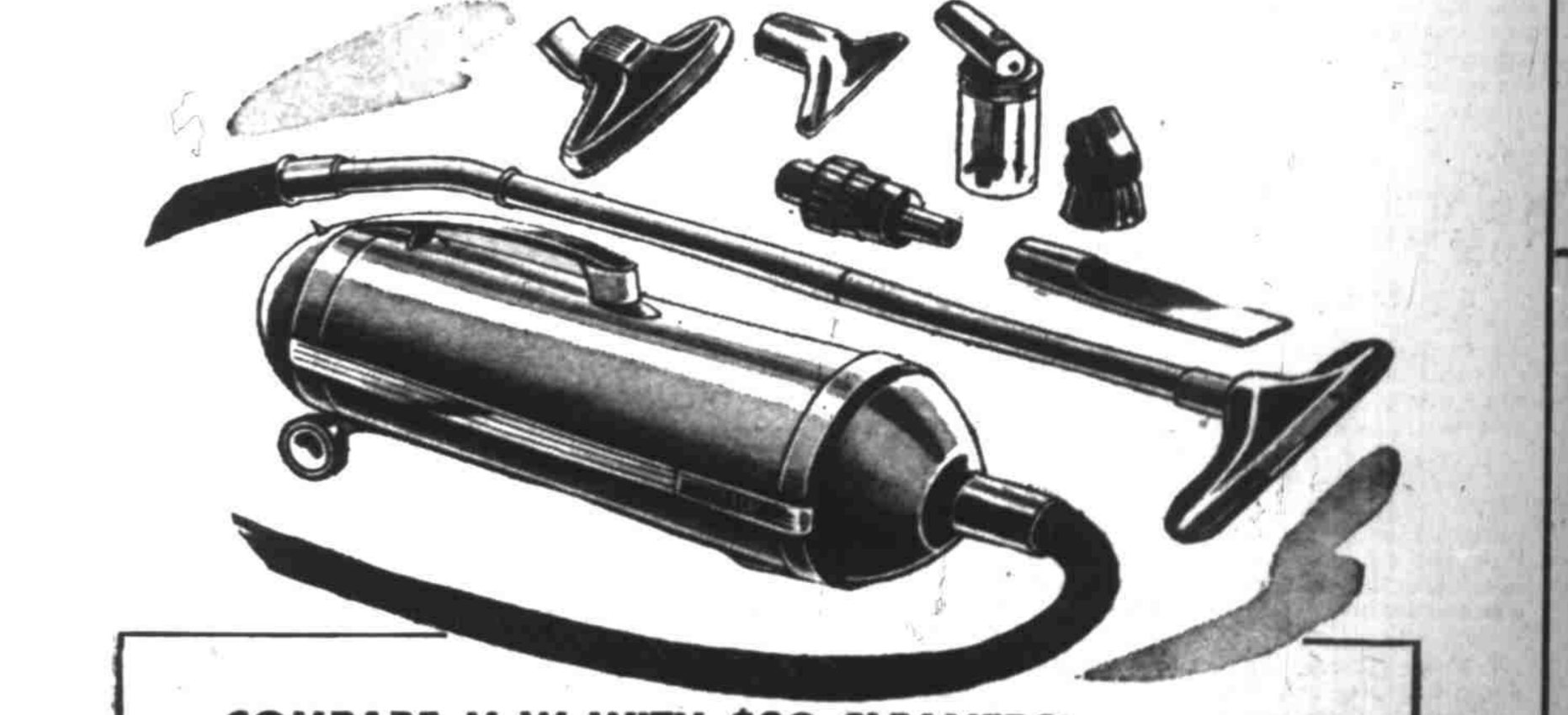
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
