

Singing, Acting Given Praise in WU Musical Comedy 'Roberta'

The melodious musical comedy "Roberta" by the Willamette University Workshop players proved to be a "full" evening's enjoyment Friday night to an audience which approached the auditorium's capacity. It will be repeated tonight at 8:15. The players are to be highly praised for the fine work they did in the few short weeks since their last production. The performance was long (almost four hours) but "Roberta" is always long, partly because of necessity of many changes of scenery.

The players are to be warmly commended for their splendid singing and acting, and the chorus work and musicians of the orchestra for their support. First praise goes to Norma Lu Faaborg, a newcomer to the Willamette productions, who as "Stephanie" displayed a fine voice and good sense of the dramatic; to Reid Shelton, an always-to-be-remembered upon performer who was John; to Bobbe Myer who as the excitable comedienne might have stolen the show but was too good a showman to do so; and to Emmett Carolan who as Huck Haines

spent profitably a lot of time on the stage. Close approach to the deadline makes a short review necessary by a none-the-less appreciative one for a show which townpeople should patronize and enjoy tonight.

Verdict Voids Labor Law

Oregon laws prohibiting labor unions from employing "secondary boycotts" and "hot cargoes" in labor disputes were in effect declared unconstitutional Thursday by the Linn county circuit court.

Circuit Judge Victor Olliver dismissed a suit brought by the Lebanon Sand and Gravel company against three Salem AFL labor organizations. The suit charged the labor unions with employing boycott and "hot cargo" methods to prevent delivery of cement from the company to Cascades Plywood corporation.

The same laws were declared unconstitutional earlier this month in a Multnomah county circuit court. Circuit Judge Charles W. Redding dismissed a suit brought by a Portland restaurant against several Portland unions on April 9.
