Rare Tiglon Born in Zoo

SALT LAKE CITY, May 6.—(AP)—A rare tiglon—offspring of a lion and tiger—was born at the Hogle Gardens zoo today.

Joseph L. Sloan, superintendent of Salt Lake City parks, said as far as he can learn the hybrid is the first to be born in the United States.

The seven-inch youngster was born in a secluded cage to Daisy, female tiger born in San Francisco's zoological gardens and presented to the zoo here Dec. 8, 1944.

The father is Huey, male lion born here in 1941.

Sloan said the tiglon has a large head like a lion cub, and its body is striped like a tiger.

Chrysler Strike Nears Certainty

DETROIT, May 6.—(AP)—The CIO-United auto workers broke off wage talks with Chrysler Corp. today and said a strike of 75,000 workers Wednesday "is inevitable."

The walkout, if called, will be the first major strike in the auto industry since the union's 113-day fight with General Motors Corp. in 1945-46.

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Marshall Supports Reciprocal Trade

WASHINGTON, May 6.—(AP)—Secretary of State Marshall declared today that if congress cripples the reciprocal trade program this nation's global prestige will suffer. Planning for a three-year continuation of the trade act, Marshall told a house ways and means subcommittee the reciprocal tariffs program is the "cornerstone and keystone of our foreign economic policy."

Stockmen Ask Vets Appointed

Marion County Livestock association, at a special meeting at the Salem Chamber of Commerce Thursday night, went on record to recommend to the county court that two full-time veterinarians be obtained to do the brucellosis testing.

Under the present system, veterinarians are paid per number of cows tested.

The association felt that the recommendation would furnish a more satisfactory and less costly method of control. It pointed out that at present testing was costing the county \$16,000 and with beef cattle added, as they will be after July 1, an additional cost of \$8000 was estimated. Under the proposed system the association estimated that all testing, beef cattle included, could be done at a cost of \$16,000.

Falling Boom Hits Worker
Barry Campbell, 632 N. Liberty st., was seriously injured Thursday when struck by a derrick boom while working with a Pacific Telephone & Telegraph company crew on a bridge near the penitentiary on East State street.

City first aid men took Campbell to Salem Memorial hospital where he was treated for a broken arm and shoulder and back injuries. Hospital authorities Thursday night said he was "resting well."

Campbell was injured when a cable supporting the derrick boom separated, dropping the boom across his shoulder. The crew was lifting a heavy postion from the stream when the accident occurred.

PORTLAND, May 6.—(AP)—A young man accused of bank robbery who chose to conduct his own defense obtained a "hung" jury in federal court here today.

He is Sam Scribner, 30, of Berkeley, Calif., charged with being one of two men who stole \$31,431 from the E. G. Young & Co. bank at Oakland, Ore., a year ago.

The jury deliberated 25 hours, reported it was "hopelessly deadlocked," and was dismissed. Scribner smiled and commented: "It could have been worse." Date for a new trial has not been set.
