

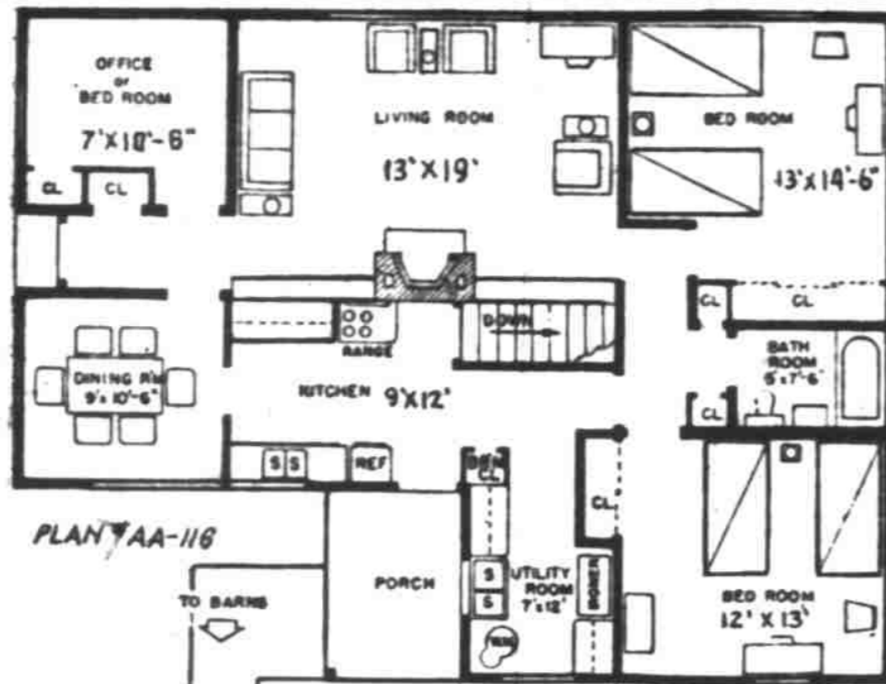
Jefferson Church Annual Breakfast Honors 85 Women

Corvallis Case Starts; Viewed as Labor Law Test

CORVALLIS, May 3 — First apparent test of the Taft-Hartley labor act in this area, involving a Corvallis motor company, is now underway, it was reported here.

A charge of unfair labor practices against the Wood Motor company has been filed with the national labor relations board, Herbert Barker, executive secretary of the Salem trades and labor council, said there.

Machinists union, local 1506, has filed the charges. The union alleges two men were discharged from the company in March, because of union activity, Barker said.

H. W. Wood, operator of the company, in a brief filed with the NLRB on Friday, alleged that one man was discharged because there was not sufficient work available and the other for cause.

Barker said the section of the Taft-Hartley act involved prohibiting employers from coercing union employees.

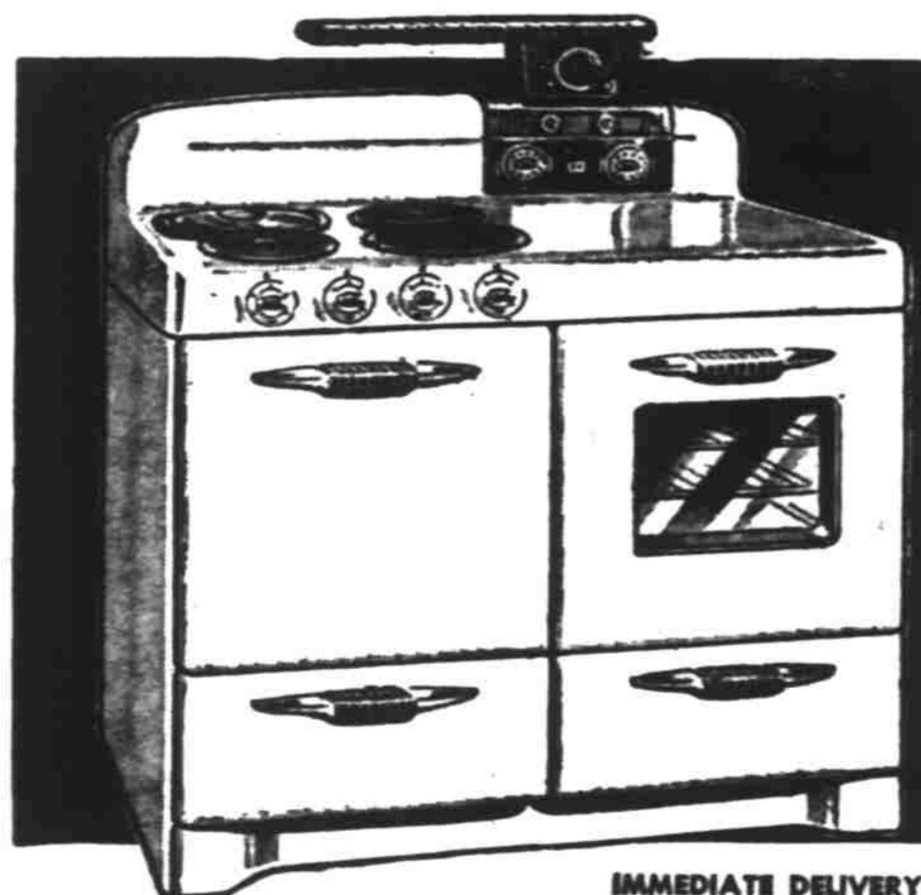
