

## New Proposal Added to St. Paul Union High School Controversy

ST. PAUL, Ore., May 6.—The formation of a 12-district Union high school for northern Marion county was proposed today in the latest development of a controversy over the already-approved \$195,000 high school in St. Paul.

The proposal was in the form of an offer, by William A. Brown, to donate 25 acres of land at Broadacres east of here for a new union high school on condition that all 12 northern Marion county elementary school districts form a new unit.

The \$195,000 school contemplated here would serve only the six elementary districts now in the St. Paul Union High school district—St. Paul, Four Corners, Mahony, Raybell, Arbor Grove and Champeog.

The other six elementary districts in this end of the county are Hubbard, Broadacres, Butteville, Donald, Aurora and White School. None of the latter are in a high school district.

Brown's offer was made to Roger F. Williams of Mahony and Walter Smith of Champeog, who with Henry Zorn of Champeog constitute a committee opposing the new high school here. The committee represents four of the St. Paul union high school's six elementary districts—Mahony, Raybell, Arbor Grove and Champeog.

### Proceeding With Plans

Meantime, so far as could be learned the St. Paul union high board was proceeding with plans for the \$195,000 school previously voted.

The new nearby site was approved 314 to 135, and removal 308 to 138, in a district-wide vote Wednesday when the balloting was enlivened by controversy as to property qualifications.

It is known that factions opposing the high school here have been studying Wednesday's vote with a view to possibly challenging the results on the grounds that votes should not have been accepted from persons whose only property qualifications constituted stock or membership in the St. Paul Telephone Co-operative.

Mrs. Carl Smith, chairman of the election board, said, however, that assurance had been received from the Marion county tax office that the telephone co-operative was on the assessment rolls and therefore that members were eligible to vote.

The current controversy dates back to the time when the St. Paul union high school district was informed the school must be improved to conform to educational standards.

The issues of taxes and community loyalty have played their part since.

Proponents of the new high school here have declared that present facilities are inadequate, that there is no other reasonable way to provide high school advantages to children of this area.

## 1,600 Boys to March in Scout Circus Parade

Approximately 1,600 boys will march through Salem Saturday morning in the opening event of the annual Cascade area council Boy Scout circus. The parade will start from Marion square at 10:30 o'clock. The circus will begin at 8 p.m. in the state fairgrounds horse show pavilion.

Line of march will be south on Commercial to State street, east to Liberty, north to Court, east to High, south to State and east into the courthouse grounds to disband. The reviewing stand will be at the chamber of commerce.

Leading the parade, according to Edward Majek, chairman, will be the Sea Scout Ship Williamette. The first section will be Boy Scout troops, followed by Cub Scouts, senior units and a Sweet Home group of scouts and floats. The Salem Saddle club and Marion County Sheriff's posse will follow.

Bands, one in each section, will be from Leslie and Parrish Junior High schools, Salem high and Sweet Home scout troop. An added feature will be the state boys' training school drum and bugle corps from Woodburn.

Ribbons will be awarded on the basis of parade appearance and conduct.

Among the numbers included in the evening program is the annual Eagle court of honor, largest yet in this council. The 14 scouts to receive the Eagle award are Gordon Garboden, John Fleming, Robert Cooley, David Cooley, Lloyd Hamlin, Bob Dyer, James Todd, Ervin Shephard and Gary Messing, all of Salem; Conrad Hamman, Gary Burch and Richard Mills, all of Independence; Ralph Lee and Dick Camberg, both of Sweet Home.

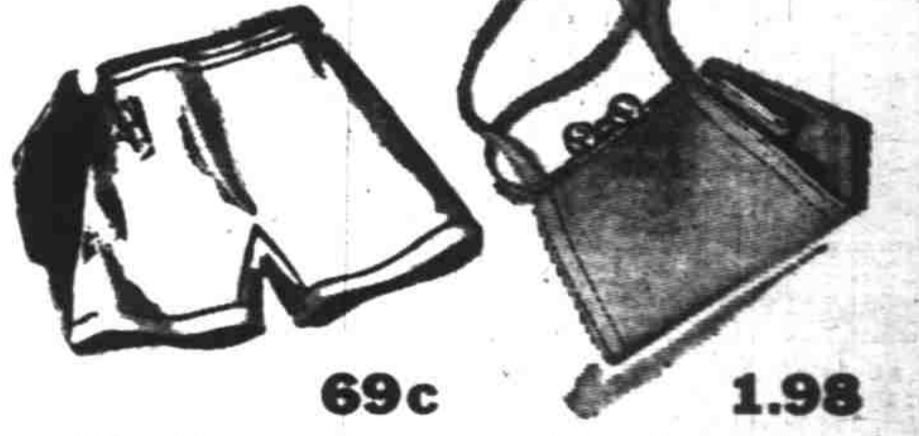
