 roud on Buddy Hjelmas's double, a ground out and Brenner's long fly to right. Salem was in front 1-0 at the time as a result of first inning doubles, both well tagged, by Mel Nunes and Spaefer. The Caps went in front in the sixth on Frank Mullens' infield single and his theft of second and third. The latter try caught the entire Salem inner defense snoozing, and when Lazor was finally informed that Mullens was en route to second to third he in haste made a bad throw to Nunes. Mullens trotted on in with the run.  
 Olson was in trouble often in his game, but three Salem double plays, plus some great defensive scrambling by Sinovic in center field, pulled him out. Jim gave 10 hits, but the Caps in turn left 11 runners stranded and obligingly biffed into the needed double killings.

Salem had only four hits off Hal Saltzman, the former U of Oregon whiz, but three of the four figured into the two runs. In the fifth Sinovic opened with a rifle-shot double down the third base line and Johnny Johnson singled him to third. Dick came on in Jim Wert's left to right field. Gentzkow walked, moving Johnson to second, and with two outs Mel Nunes punched a single to right to tally Johnson. It was Saltzman's lone bad inning and it cost him the ball game.

Both Lazor and Olson, plus Messers Gunnarson and Saltzman, should be commended for their control. Usually the pitching this season has been so that bases on balls are dirt cheap, and costly. Last night Vinow walked only two, as did Olson. Gunnarson passed once, but ironically enough, it helped beat him. Saltzman walked four, and the one to Gentzkow in the fifth hurt him.

Some sort of record must have been made in the tilts, for no less than nine double plays were made. Vancouver had four in the first game and two in the second. Salem had the three big ones on Olson in the second. . . . Fielding gems popped up all over the park. Mullens and Sammy Samborner in the outfield and Len Tran on third had some dandies for the Caps. Sinovic and steady Joe Gedzius were the sharpies for the lowlives. . . . The cold must have been disagreeable to Ump "Moose" Dehaney's temperament, for in the second game he "ran" Caps Bill Reese for something Bill must have said while way over in the dugout . . .

# ROOKS, FROSH SPLIT

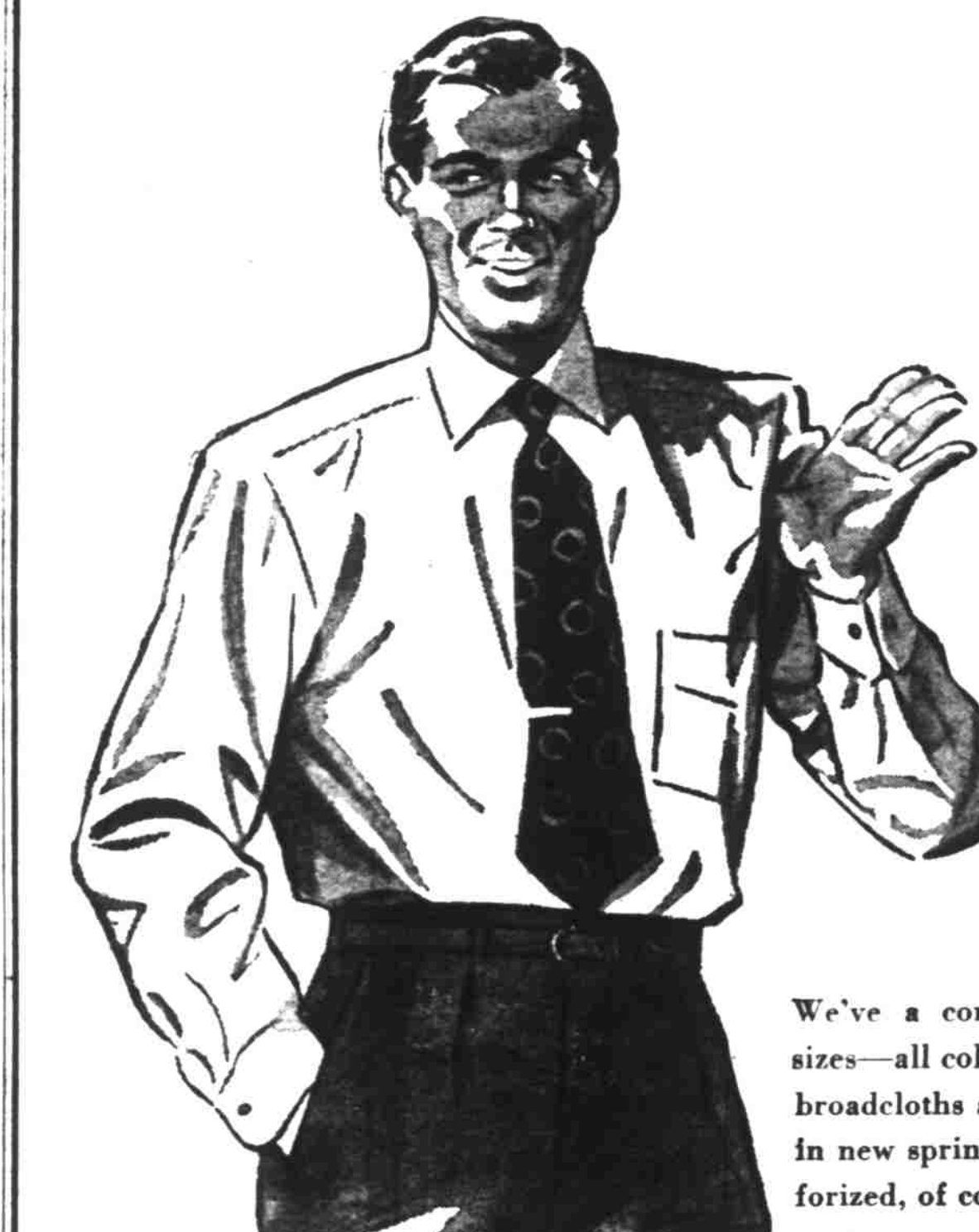

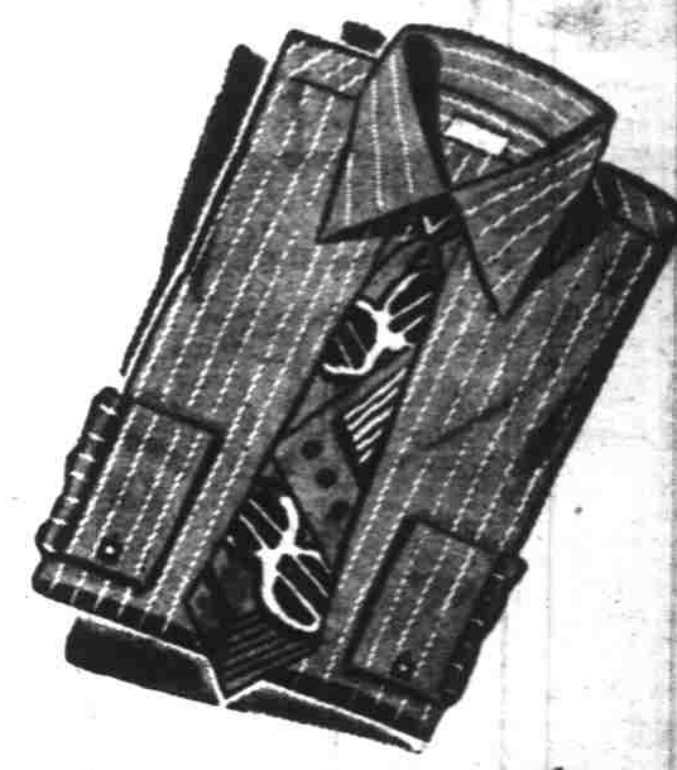
