Champion Mare to Enter Salem Horse Show; Races Scheduled

Huba Huba, grand champion mare at the Tucson, Ariz., show this spring, will enter the quarter horse shows at the state fairgrounds on Friday and Saturday nights of this week in the first quarter horse show to be held at Salem. Clay Nichols, Lebanon, is general chairman. The shows, as well as the races each afternoon and the sale Saturday morning, are sponsored by the Northwest Quarter Horse association which held its first event last year at Klamath Falls.

Shows are scheduled for 8 o'clock both evenings and Sig Jernigan of Gold Waith, Texas, official representative of the American Quarter Horse association, will judge the halter classes. Four classes of mares will be placed on Friday night and a like number of stallion groups on the Saturday night program. Trophies go to grand champion stallion and grand champion mare. The famous Topper has been listed for showing, and among the local horses in the halter classes are Walter Zose's yearling colt and a stallion owned by Tom Allen.

A special event to demonstrate the quarter horses as a working animal will be the calf roping contests in which Cecil Bedford, Touchet, Wash.; Mac Price, Lebanon, and Leo Thorne, Del Rio, Texas, will compete for \$1,000 prize money offered for the best average time on three calves tied each night. Only registered quarter horses will be used as mounts in this event. Besides the halter and roping events there will be cutting events as well.

C. Huston Walter of Lebanon is chairman of the night show programs.

Races start both afternoons at 1:30 o'clock. Eight races are limited to quarter horses with four events open to horses of any breed. Races will be run at distances of 220 yards, 300 yards and 440 yards. Pari mutual betting has been arranged for. O. M. Stevenson, Lebanon, and L. R. Arndus, Dillard, who are in charge of the race event, are planning use of starting gates.

Fifty registered quarter horses will be offered at the sale Saturday at 10:30 a. m. with H. H. Sager of Bozeman, Mont., as the auctioneer. Roy L. Mead of Grants Pass is the sale manager. While some Texas and Arizona horses are listed for sale, the majority of those consigned are Oregon bred.

Gov. Jester Asks West, Southern Democrats Unite

AUSTIN, Tex., May 12 (AP)—Southern and western democrats should join forces to wrest control of the national party from northern and eastern leadership, Gov. Beauford H. Jester suggested Tuesday.

The Texas governor has been working quietly on the coalition project for several months and has been promised aid by at least three other governors. Others have shown interest, Jester said today.

Jester at the same time indicated he is standing firm on his earlier advice to Texas democrats not to bolt the party and join the southern revolt.
