Veterans in the two Oregon hospitals have made more than 400,000 poppies this spring to be sold on Poppy days May 28 and 29. For making these red crepe paper poppies the veteran receives two cents apiece. For many this is the only possibility of earning money during the year. The remainder of the proceeds of the sale is equally divided for veteran rehabilitation work and for veteran child welfare work.

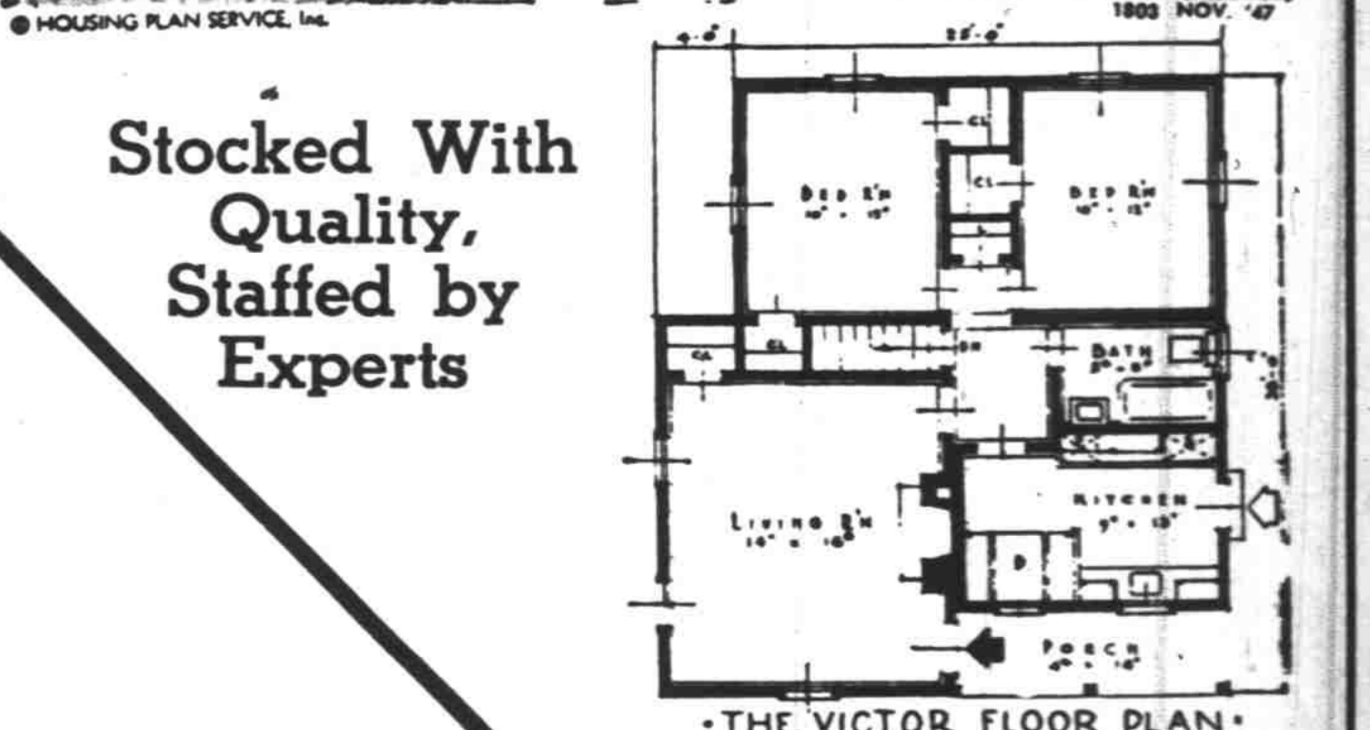

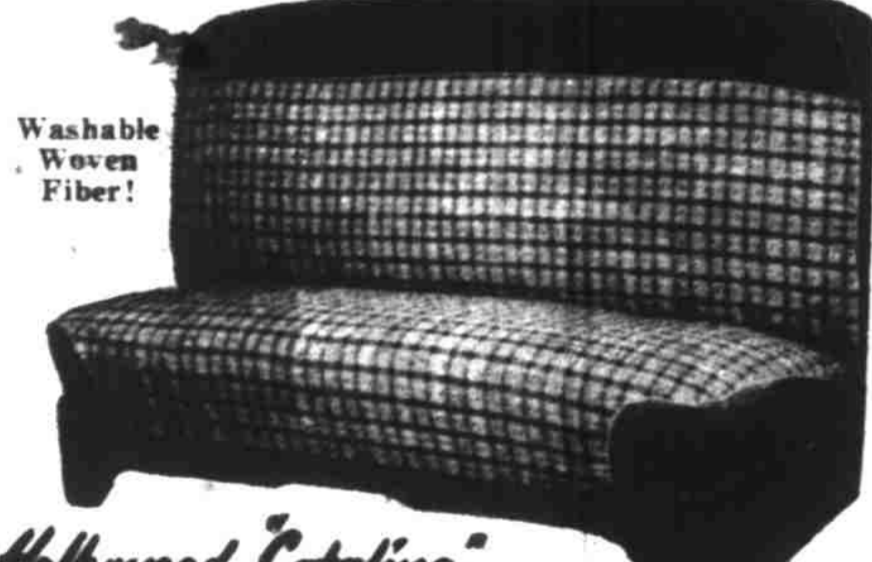
