Postoffice Receipts Top Lebanon Records

LEBANON, May 15—Postoffice receipts at the Lebanon office continue to break all precedents with \$19,026 in the first four months, compared to \$16,150 for the same period in 1947, according to Postmaster Merrill Smith. April receipts were over 1947 by \$5,333 against \$3,913. Smith said there was every indication to believe the 1948 total would substantially surpass last year's record of \$52,213.

Airmail Celebrates Birthday



Saturday marked the 30th anniversary of the inception of air mail delivery in the United States, but it has only been since December, 1941, that Salem has had direct air mail pick up on United Air Lines at McNary field. Air mail cost 24 cents per ounce in 1918; eight cents per ounce in 1941; and now is only five cents per ounce with surer and speedier delivery. Shown above is Leonard Odom, route 9, box 71A, air mail clerk at the Salem postoffice, holding a pouch indicating the amount of air mail sent out of Salem each day early in 1942; while on the bench are four sacks equivalent to each day's air mail sent out of the Salem postoffice at present. The small sack represents about five pounds and the others 60 pounds.
