1. Repeal the state withholding tax.
2. Reduce state income taxes by restoring the higher exemptions in effect prior to the 1947 legislative session: from \$1000 to \$1500 for married persons; \$500 to \$750 for single persons.
3. "Humanize" the state income tax by allowing deductions for Unusual Medical Expense and Life Insurance Premiums up to \$250 a year.
4. Set aside half the treasury surplus to prevent tax increases when tax revenues drop.
