Interesting activities for senior Girl Scouts were featured topic at a meeting of Girl Scout representatives from all parts of western Oregon held in Eugene May 13, reports Mrs. Walter Spaulding, Salem, president of the Santiam area council who headed the delegation from the Santiam area council. Thompson, Albany, district chairman; Mrs. Edwin Fortmiller, Albany, of the region XI committee, who presided at the meeting, and Miss Lucy McAfee, executive director.

Girl Scout membership in region XI, including Oregon, Washington, Idaho and Montana, had the third highest growth in the nation during 1947, an increase of 22 per cent to bring the membership to over 52,000. Oregon's Girl Scout membership is now over 18,000, Miss Esther Ansel, regional director, reported.

Miss Ansel also told of the progress of the Clothing for Friendship Kits project, through which Girl Scouts will provide complete wardrobe for 100,000 ragged children overseas this year. Region XI has sent 235 kits to date, 79 of them from Oregon. Girl Scouts of the Santiam area are trying to clothe at least 160 children this year.

Plans made at the sectional meeting included training courses and conferences for Girl Scout workers in the region, and a Senior Girl Scout conference to be held in Oregon in the fall of 1949.

An invitation was extended by Mrs. Spaulding to have next year's western Oregon sectional meeting in Salem.

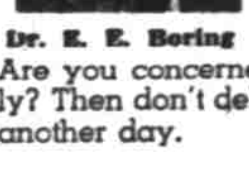
Shower Honors Mrs. Lurty

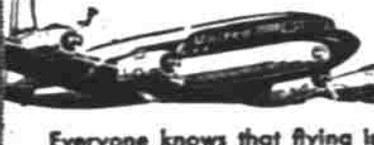
Liberty - Wayne Blacio was taken to the hospital Wednesday after suffering a heart attack.
