CHICAGO, June 7—(AP)— Wheat prices were weighed down by the rapidly advancing harvest in the southwest today. Losses averaging around a cent were enough to send May, 1949, wheat to a new seasonal low. The 1948 contracts hovered only a few cents above the government loan level.

Corn and oats ignored the weakness of wheat. Both feed grains were firm throughout the contracts June 6, George Givens, with concluding services in Bell-crest Memorial park.


