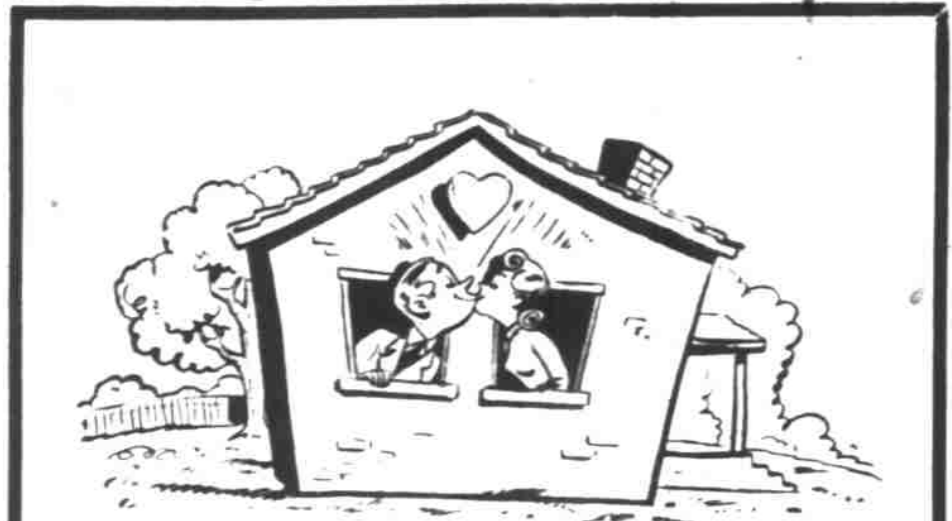


NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS

1,200 L.F. 72" Extra Strength Reinforced Concrete Culvert Pipe.
1,633 L.F. 66" Extra Strength Reinforced Concrete Culvert Pipe.
7,778 L.F. 60" Extra Strength Reinforced Concrete Culvert Pipe.
(Bidders shall submit alternate on 4" and 6" joints.)
The above described pipe must conform with A.S.T.M. Standard Specifications for Reinforced Concrete

vert Pipe C76-41 or revisions thereof. Bids are to be on a unit price per linear foot of pipe, delivered to the site of the work, which is along the alignment of a sewer to be constructed from near the center of the City of Salem to a point on the Willamette River approximately two miles North, plans for which may be inspected at the office of the City Engineer.
Bidders shall state the earliest date for beginning delivery of pipe, with the understanding that pipe will be delivered thereafter at a minimum rate of 50 linear feet per day.

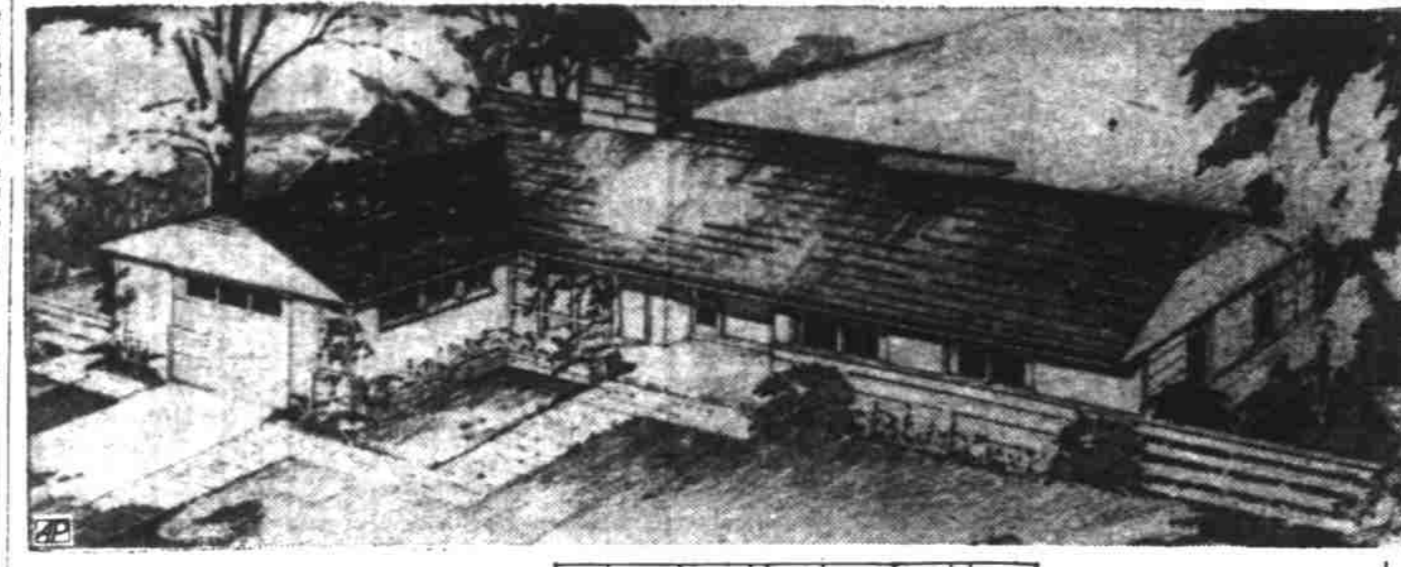

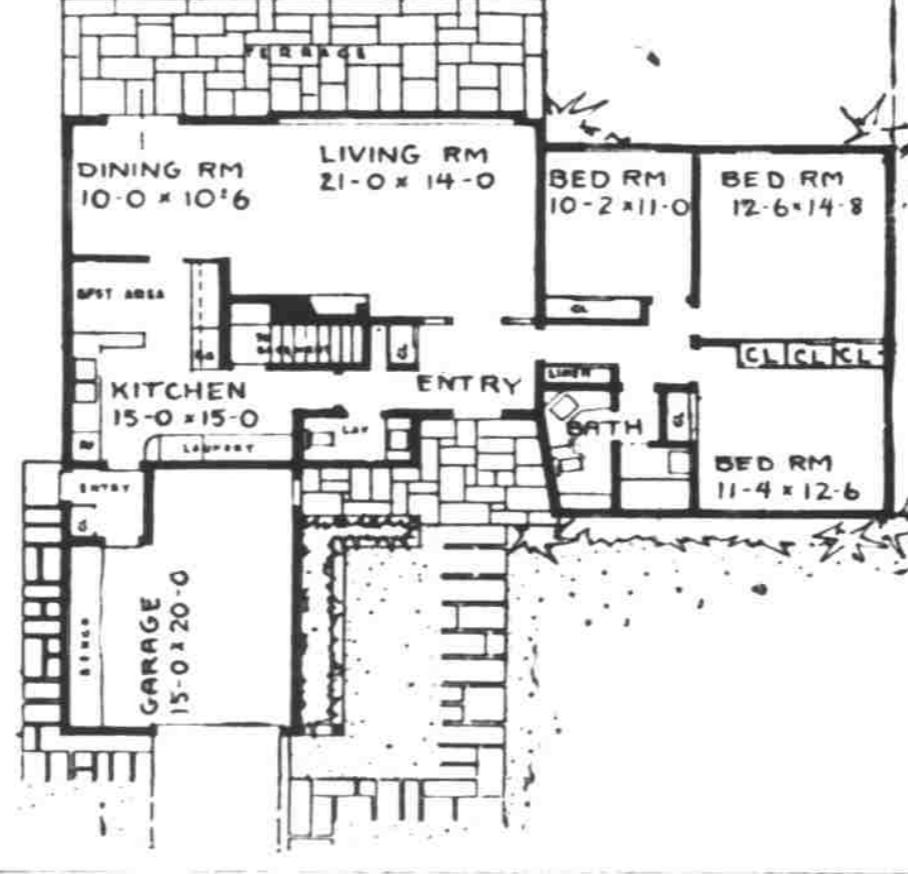

Workability rather than any rigid style is stressed in this plan 717. Walter T. Agicka, architect, 617 Forest Ave., Ann Arbor, Mich. Each family comfort is the motif. Says department of the house — sleeping, living and service — is accessible from the entrance hall, and grouped independently for maximum efficiency. The house has a volume of 17,660 cubic feet including a basement under the living room and kitchen areas, but exclusive of the garage. Sliding doors are used for all closets and a row of closets makes a storage wall between two of the bedrooms. The bathroom is divided to permit part of it to serve as a powder room. For color, the architect suggests gray exterior walls with white trim, porch alcove in yellow, and dark asphalt shingles.

If Oregon is to have the telephone service it needs
If the people of Oregon are to have the amount and kind of telephone service they are demanding and should be furnished, we must have enough price relief to meet current wages and costs and to keep our credit sound.
Our price levels in Oregon have lagged far behind general price levels. The increase in revenues granted last January, the first increase in over a quarter of a century, averaged only 9 1/2 per cent. We wish we could pay post-war prices for all that we buy and charge only slightly more than prewar prices for what we have to sell but this is impossible.
Our earnings in Oregon, including the rate revisions granted last January, won't do the job. Current earnings on the dollars invested in Oregon are less than half of what are needed to do the job.
Between now and the end of next year we should spend \$26,500,000 to enlarge and improve the telephone system to meet the needs of the people of Oregon. To do this we must go to investors for money. Investors are alike in one thing—they put their dollars where they can expect safety and a fair return.
To provide a fair return, we are filing new rate schedules with the Public Utilities Commissioner of Oregon.
