Gardening Today

"The weather that grows corn, kills the lupine," has frequently been said of these lovely sprays of spring.

But most of the corn now being planted is hybrid varieties, adapted to the Willamette valley conditions, and the same holds true of the lupine. Lupine has done unusually well this spring with the comparatively cool days. Even the native lupine along the roadside was extra lovely this spring.



Lupines are among our best spring border plants. They are showy and their last for quite a spell. They like best a deep well-drained soil with plenty of sun and protection from winds. The soil should be rather on the rich side and moisture-retentive. Plenty of sand added to the bed and mixed with well-decayed cow barn fertilizer seems beneficial.

When lupines are through blooming and have faded, cut the stalks low, like you do delphiniums and let the plants rest until rather late in August. Then water them deep, feed them with a balanced fertilizer and look for a September crop of bloom. Moving and dividing may be done in autumn after the second blooming period or very early in spring. If grown by seed, remember they are very slow in germinating. Do not become discouraged too early when the plants

fail to show up when you think they should.

Questions and Answers
Mrs. C. D. sends three weeds for identification.

Ans.: No. 1 is chickweed and easily eradicated; No. 2 is Queen Anne's Lace and a little more difficult to eradicate; should not be permitted to go to seed; No. 3 is Lamium or dead-nettle. It spreads rapidly and will respond to a weed killer provided other plants are not in the neighborhood which might also be effected by the killer. Lamium pulled up easily and can also be killed by spraying under provided this is done freely and spreads very rapidly.

B.M.S. describes injury to hydrangea asks where to plant Mt. Hood lilies, asks about sawdust mulch and rhododendrons.

Ans.: Your hydrangeas were undoubtedly injured by the late frost we had this spring. This year it even killed some of the lilac following buds which most Willamette valley gardeners tell you they

have never seen happen before. Mt. Hood lilies like best a well-drained, deep moist soil and partial shade. Keep the rhododendrons well mulched and water thoroughly a few times during the dry season. Sawdust mulch is good and there does not seem to be too much difference in the variety. Don't dig it into the soil for a year or two unless you are sure of the nitrogenous matter is also added.

A.R.N.D. asks if she should sow her perennial seeds now or wait until fall. She is starting a perennial border.

Ans.: Start the seeds as early as possible now in order not to lose another year. Many of the plants will be ready to set out this autumn into their permanent place. They, too, are lovely in the perennial border.

S.T.T. asks if the seedpods should be removed from the rhododendrons or permitted to ripen before they are taken off. Says someone advised the latter for the "benefit of the bush."

Ans.: The bush will be benefited much more if the pods are removed. Not only does your shrub look better but it will bloom much better next spring. This also applies to the lily-of-the-valley shrub.
