Lebanon Sets Berry Prices

LEBANON—Strawberry picking in eastern Linn county fields was generally under way on a moderate scale last week, with growers paying 4½ cents minimum price per pound to pickers, with a few offering an additional half cent bonus to those remaining all season.

The picking price was universally adopted by area growers during the Lacombe Berry Growers association meeting Wednesday night in Sanders hall, according to F. W. Worral, manager of the Lebanon employment office.

Growers have apparently found sufficient pickers to handle first pickings, with calls for only 100 pickers being placed with the local employment office. Continued warm weather is expected to change the need and a heavy demand is anticipated before next week end.

Growers are not offering transportation this year, apparently relying upon people living in nearby areas to furnish the bulk of help. If the demand for more help is made, there appears a possibility that Lacombe and Waterloo area growers may resort to use of trucks. At present however, none are available for those without private means of travel, thus eliminating several prospective pickers who have registered for work.

If a harvest of berries is expected to begin in earnest early this week, it was pointed out at the Lacombe meeting, with nearly all acreages anticipating heavier crops than were expected about four weeks ago.
